



Official Program

Conducted by the Civilian Marksmanship Program in Cooperation with the Army, Marine Corps, Navy and Air Force JROTC Commands
Anniston, Alabama; 21 – 23 March 2019

General. This is the Official Program for the **2019 JROTC NATIONAL AIR RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIP**. It governs the conduct of the championship and provides detailed information for participating instructors and cadets.

- ⊙ **Rules.** All competition events will be 10-meter three-position air rifle events. The **2018-2020 12th Edition National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules** govern the championship. Copies of the rulebook may be obtained from the CMP or may be downloaded from the CMP web site at <http://thecmp.org/wp-content/uploads/Rules.pdf>
- ⊙ **Qualifying Teams and Individuals.** 28 teams and 32 individual qualifiers in the sporter class and 17 teams and 17 individuals in the precision class have been invited to participate, for a total of 144 sporter shooters and 85 precision shooters. All qualifiers are selected from scores fired in the 2019 JROTC Service Championships in accordance with selection procedures published in the **Service Championship Official Match Program**.
- ⊙ **Organizer and Host.** The championship competition will be organized and hosted by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP).
- ⊙ **Competition Sanction.** The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council has sanctioned the competition and scores fired may be recognized as national records.
- ⊙ **EIC Credit Points.** The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council recognizes the championship as a "National Council Championship." The top 50% of all competitors in the individual events will receive credit points towards Junior Distinguished status in accordance with National Council regulations.
- ⊙ **Location and Facilities.** The championship will take place at the CMP Competition Center in Anniston, Alabama located at, 1470 Sentinel Drive, Anniston, AL 36207.
- ⊙ **Championship Events.** The competition program includes these events:
 - **Team Championship, Sporter and Precision Classes.** Members of qualifying four-person unit teams will fire two three-position, 3X20 courses of fire, one on each day of the championship. Final team rankings will be determined by the total of the two days' scores of the four team members.
 - **Individual Championship, Sporter and Precision Classes.** All competitors, team members and at-large individuals, will compete in the individual championship. At the end of each day's 3x20 course of fire, the eight highest scoring sporter and eight highest-scoring precision class individuals will compete in 10-shot finals. The JROTC National Individual Champions will be the competitors with the highest totals of the two 3X20 scores plus each competitor's average final scores (If a shooter is in only one final, that score is his/her average). A competitor who qualifies for the final must shoot the final or receive a score of zero for that final.

Team Entry Confirmation. All units with qualifying teams or at-large individuals are requested to confirm their intent to participate in the championship not later than 12Mar19. Registration information can be found at <http://thecmp.org/air/jrotc-air-rifle-national-championship/>

Team Members. Each qualified JROTC unit team will be allowed to register **four** cadets. Each of the cadets must have fired in their 2018-2019 JROTC postal competition (waivers may be requested for cadets who were unable to fire due to illness, schedule conflicts, etc.). Team members do not have to be the same team members who fired on a unit's team in the Service Championship or Postal. All team members must be JROTC cadets who are currently enrolled in JROTC or JROTC cadets who, because of block scheduling, are precluded from enrolling in JROTC during the current semester/quarter, but who were enrolled in JROTC during the previous semester/quarter. Teams may bring and substitute an alternate for a named team member not later than the start of firing on the first competition day (22Mar19). However, any alternate who is not one of the four team firing members will not be permitted to fire.

Team Check-In and Equipment Control. Check-in for teams and at-large individuals will be open from 0830 – 1400 on Thursday 22Mar18. At check-in, teams must confirm their final entries. All competitors must have their air rifles and shooting equipment checked at equipment control prior to official training.

Entry Fees. The entry fee for each firing team member and individual is \$30. Unit instructors will receive complimentary tickets to the banquet. Additional banquet tickets can be purchased for \$20.00.

Squadding. Three relays will be scheduled. Squadding will be posted online at www.thecmp.org one week prior to the event. Team members will be squadded together on the same relay. Within the team's firing points individual squadding cannot be changed once assigned.

Electronic Targets. The match will be fired on Kongsberg Target System (KTS) Electronic Targets. Spotting scopes are not permitted (rule 4.7.3).

Shooting Mats. Shooting mats are available for use.

Sports Presentation and Music. Music will not be played during the qualification rounds, but will be played during the finals, in accordance to rule 7.14.

Air and CO2. Compressed air and CO₂ gas will be available at the range.

- ⊙ **Shipping Air Cylinders.** Teams that plan to fly, who do not wish to check air or CO₂ cylinders on their air flights may ship them in advance to:

- ⊙ Air cylinder packages should have the name of the school or JROTC unit printed on the outside of the package.
- ⊙ Please purchase a return label in advance and bring it with you.

Awards and Participant Recognition. The following awards will be presented to winners in the sporter and precision classes:

- ⊙ Day 1/Day 2 Individual Winners (3x20 + final). Gold, silver and bronze medallions with neck ribbons for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place individuals. These awards will be presented on the range, immediately after final.
- ⊙ National JROTC Individual Championship (2x3x20 + final ave.). Gold, silver and bronze medallions with neck ribbons for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place individuals. Bronze medals will also be awarded to 4th - 10th place.
- ⊙ National JROTC Team Championship. The overall 1st place team in both sporter and precision will receive a national championship trophy for the unit, five individual gold medals for the four team members and coach. The 2nd and 3rd place teams will receive a trophy and five individual medals. The 4th and 5th place team will receive trophies and medals.
- ⊙ All participating teams (to include teams represented by individuals) will receive a 2019 National JROTC Air Rifle Championship banner.
- ⊙ All participating team members will receive 2019 National JROTC Air Rifle Championship participant pins, coin and t-shirt.

Hotel and Accommodations.

Uniforms and Clothing. Participating teams should bring service dress uniforms to wear at the closing banquet. Civilians should plan to wear a coat and tie or dress at the closing banquet. All other championship events will be informal. Army, Marine Corps, and Navy JROTC instructors please remember that ACC, TECOM and NSTC require uniforms while at this event.

Closing Banquet. The Closing Banquet and Awards Ceremony will be held at the Talladega Super Speedway in Lincoln, AL. This is located approximately 30 minutes from the range. All participating cadets and unit instructors will receive complimentary tickets to the banquet. Additional tickets may be purchased for \$20 for additional unit instructors, parents, etc.
