

CMP National 3PAR Championship

Sporter: 29 June 2019

Precision: 15 July 2019



Location and Facilities: The championships will take place at the Gary Anderson CMP Competition Center, located at Camp Perry Training Site, 1000 N. Lawrence Road Bldg #5042, Port Clinton, OH 43452.

Organizers: This competition will be organized and conducted by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP).

Competition Sanction: The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council has sanctioned this event and scores fired in this competition will count for national records.

Eligibility: All qualifying juniors and high school seniors who have just graduated are eligible. Shooters may not participate in both the Sporter and Precision competitions.

Rules: The competitions will be three-position air rifle events fired at a distance of 10 meters. Rules that will govern are:

- **2018-2020 12th Edition National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules (NS3PC).** Copies of the rules may be purchased from the Civilian Marksmanship Program, or rulebooks may be downloaded from the CMP website at <http://thecmp.org/3P/Rulebook.htm>.

Course of Fire: The course of fire will be one 3x20 three position air rifle event. Teams will be comprised of four members selected before the competition begins. A final will be fired for the top 8 individuals.

Awards: Awards will be presented at the National 3PAR Championship Awards Ceremony. The awards will take place at the Hough Theater across from the Gary Anderson CMP Marksmanship Center.

- **Individual Awards.** The individual sporter and precision class winners will receive gold medals and the 2nd place individuals will receive silver medals. Sporter and Precision class individuals in places 3 through 8 will receive bronze medals. In addition, CMP will present award checks in the amount of \$1000 for 1st – 3rd, and \$500 for 4th – 8th.
- **Individual Age Group Awards.** First through third age Group II (15 and 16 year olds) and Age Group III (14 and younger) medallions will be presented. The top 8 individuals (already receiving individual awards) will not be eligible for these awards.
- **Graduated Senior Scholarships.** The top three graduating seniors in each class will be awarded a CMP Scholarship for \$1000.
- **Overall Team Awards.** The winning sporter and precision class teams will each receive a trophy and gold medals for each team member. The second-place teams will each receive a trophy and silver medals, the third-place team will receive a trophy and bronze medals for each team member. In addition, CMP will present award checks to the top three teams. (1st - \$4000, 2nd - \$3000, 3rd - \$2,000).
- **Team Category Awards:** The first-place teams in each category (club and scholastic) will receive a high team plaque. Overall team award winners will be eligible to receive these awards and may receive the plaque in addition to their overall awards.
- **Midway USA Foundation Endowment Awards.** In 2019, Larry and Brenda Potterfield Co-Founders of the MidwayUSA Corporation have again provided generous donations for this Championship. The MidwayUSA Foundation is a 501c(3) public charity that helps communities and organizations raise funds to support youth shooting teams and activities. The Foundation is an endowment which helps fund team expenses today and into the future.

EIC Credit Points: The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council recognizes the CMP National Three Position Air Rifle Championship as a National Council Member Championship. The top 50% of all Non-Distinguished competitors in the overall individual rankings will receive EIC credit points (counts toward Junior Distinguished status) in accordance with National Council regulations (Appendix D in the National Standard Rules).

National Junior Olympic 3PAR Championship

Sporter: 28 June 2019

Precision: 14 July 2019



Location and Facilities: The championships will take place at the Gary Anderson CMP Competition Center, located at Camp Perry Training Site, 1000 N. Lawrence Road Bldg #5042, Port Clinton, OH 43452.

Organizers: This competition will be organized and conducted by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) in partnership with USA Shooting (USAS).

Competition Sanction: The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council has sanctioned this event and scores fired in this competition will count for national records.

Eligibility: All qualifying juniors and high school seniors who have just graduated are eligible. Shooters may not participate in both the Sporter and Precision competitions.

Rules: The competitions will be three-position air rifle events fired at a distance of 10 meters. Rules that will govern are:

- **2018-2020 12th Edition National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules (NS3PC).** Copies of the rules may be purchased from the Civilian Marksmanship Program, or rulebooks may be downloaded from the CMP website at <http://thecmp.org/3P/Rulebook.htm>.

Course of Fire. The course of fire will be one 3x20 three position air rifle event. Teams will be comprised of four members selected before the competition begins. A final will be fired for the top 8 individuals.

AWARDS. Awards will be presented at the National 3PAR Championship Awards Ceremony. The awards will take place at the Hough Theater across from the Gary Anderson CMP Marksmanship Center.

- **Individual Awards:** The top eight individuals in the sporter and precision events will be awarded medals.
- **Age Group Awards:** Age category medals will be awarded to the top three shooters in Age Group 2 - 3. Those athletes already earning overall medals (top 8) are not eligible for these awards.
- **Team Awards:** The top three teams in the Sporter and Precision events will be awarded medals and team trophies.
- **Team Category Awards:** The first-place teams in each category (club and scholastic) will receive a high team plaque. Overall team award winners will be eligible to receive these awards and may receive the plaque in addition to their overall awards.
- **American Legion Awards:** The top performing individuals (sporter and precision) who are members of clubs and teams affiliated with The American Legion Junior Shooting Sports Program will be awarded The American Legion JSSP trophy and special championship medals. Top performing teams (sporter and precision) who represent clubs and teams affiliated with The American Legion Junior Shooting Sports Program will be awarded The American Legion JSSP trophy and special championship medals.
- **National Junior Team Selection:** USA Shooting will present a National Junior Team slot to the top male and female shooters in the precision class. An aggregate score of the National 3PAR Junior Olympic Championship and the CMP National Championship will be used to determine who will earn this slot. If this athlete is not already a member of the National Junior Team, an official team jacket will be presented during the awards ceremony.

EIC Credit Points. The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council recognizes the National Junior Olympic 3PAR Championship as a National Council Member Championship. The top 50% of all Non-Distinguished competitors in the overall individual rankings will receive EIC credit points (counts toward Junior Distinguished status) in accordance with National Council regulations (Appendix D in the National Standard Rules).
