



2018 Camp Perry Open Match Program

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The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) invites you to participate in the 12th annual Camp Perry Open. This year's match will include a three-position air rifle competition, an international air rifle (all standing) event, an international pistol event, and clinic held at the **Gary Anderson CMP Competition Center** located at Camp Perry, Ohio. The matches will be held 12 - 14 January 2018.

COMPETITION EVENTS.

- **3x20 Junior Air Rifle** – This event is governed by the **National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules**, and participants must be juniors who are eligible in accordance with Rule 3.1. Finals for the top eight in both sporter and precision will be held after each relay. Finals will be conducted using the Alternate ISSF Elimination final (Rule 10.4). The three position competition is limited to 156 competitors. EIC award points will be awarded at this competition. - **3x20 Junior Team Match** - Teams are comprised of four firing members. There is no pre-registration for teams. Pick up team cards at check-in. Teams must comply with Rule 3.2 of the National Standard Three Position Air Rifle Rulebook.
- **Clinic** – On Saturday, there will be a clinic for open and junior shooters. Those wishing to attend should pre-register. This is a classroom clinic.
- **Men's and Women's Air Rifle** – The air rifle event is open to both men and women of all ages. It is a two day event where competitors will fire 60 standing shots in accordance with USA Shooting rules. Decimal scoring will be used. A final will be held for the top 8 open and junior competitors at the conclusion of day 2. This is a **precision** rifle event.
- **Men's and Women's Air Pistol** – The air pistol event is open to both men and women of all ages. It is a two day event where competitors will fire 60 shots in accordance with USA Shooting rules. During qualification, integer scoring will be used. A final will be held for the top 8 open and junior competitors at the conclusion of day 2.

- **60 Shot Team Matches** – Teams are comprised of three firing members from the 60 shot rifle and pistol events. This match is not fired separately of the individual matches. There is no pre-registration for team events. Team cards can be picked up and paid for at check-in. Team awards will be for open and junior teams. Pick-up or unrestricted teams are allowed.
- **Super Final** – There will be a super final on Saturday. The format of the Super Final will be announced the day of the competition. This event is intended to be a fun experience for athletes and spectators.

Please only register in the air rifle or air pistol match. Due to the popularity of these events, we can only accommodate one discipline per competitor.

SQUADDING.



For the 3x20 event, please indicate on your registration which relay you would prefer to fire on. We will try to honor all squadding requests, but relays will be filled in order that entries are received. We will also try to squad all teams together on the firing line. **Squadding will be posted on-line for all entries by 6 January 2018.**

Squadding for first day of the international events will be assigned randomly and will be posted on-line. Squadding for the second day will be done using the results of the first day, and will be posted in the range and online Saturday night.

RULES.

3x20 - The competition will be governed by the **2016-2018 National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules**. Copies of the rules may be downloaded from the CMP website at <http://thecmp.org/air/national-standard-three-position-air-rifle-rules>

60 Shot Air Rifle Matches – The competition will be governed by the **USAS Rifle Rules**. One exception to these rules is that women will be shooting the 60 shot course of fire. Copies of the rules may be downloaded from the USA Shooting website at <http://www.usashooting.com/rulebook.php>.

60 Shot Air Pistol Matches – The competition will be governed by the **USAS Pistol Rules**. The exception to these rules is that women will be shooting the 60 shot course of fire. Copies of the rules may be downloaded from the USA Shooting website at <http://www.usashooting.com/rulebook.php>.

SCORE POSTING.

All scores fired will be displayed live in the CMP Competitor Tracker results system at www.theCMP.org. Scores and competitor rankings will be displayed electronically on the range throughout the competition. Preliminary and final printed results bulletins will be posted on the bulletin board.

MATCH SANCTIONING.

The 60 shot matches have been sanctioning with USA Shooting. Scores will be submitted to USA Shooting for those shooters with current USA Shooting memberships.

TRAINING.

AWARDS.

The 3x20 event will be broken into Sporter and Precision categories. Both categories will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual awards and 1st, 2nd and 3rd place team awards. Individual winners in sporter and precision classes will checks (\$200 – 1st place, \$150 – 2nd place, \$100 – 3rd place). Team awards will be given for the 1st – 3rd place teams in each category.

For the 60 shot matches, we will award 1st, 2nd and 3rd for Open and Junior categories. Individual overall winners in rifle and pistol classes will receive award checks in the amounts of: 1st - \$200, 2nd - \$150, 3rd – \$100. Team awards will be given to 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall and junior teams in rifle and pistol.

There will be a check presented to the top 3 in the super final. 1st - \$200, 2nd - \$150 3rd - \$100

EQUIPMENT.

Equipment Control – There will be no official equipment control but equipment will be checked on the range.

Prone mats – Prone mats are provided in the range, but personal mats may be used.

Electronic Targets - The match will be fired on KTS electronic targets. Shooters should not bring spotting scopes because the exact shot locations are shown on electronic monitors at each firing point.

Air and CO₂ - Compressed air and CO₂ gas will be available at the range.

Shipping Air Cylinders - Teams that plan to fly to Cleveland, Ohio; Toledo, Ohio; or Detroit, Michigan who do not wish to check air or CO₂ cylinders on their air flights may ship them in advance to:

Air cylinder packages must have the name of the school, JROTC unit or club printed on the outside of the package. It is recommended that FedEx or UPS is used so that the shipment can be located with a tracking number. **Please purchase a return label in advance and bring with you to return your cylinders home.**

HOW TO REGISTER.

To register, visit www.theCMP.org, and follow the links to the Camp Perry Open Registration page. **Registration will open on October 1, 2018.** Competitors over the age of 18 *must* complete and sign a CMP Affidavit and Liability release prior to competing at Camp Perry. Shooters under the age of 18 *must* have a 2017 Parental Permission Form completed prior to competing at Camp Perry. You can print the CMP Affidavit and Liability Release form by going to <http://thecmp.org/wp-content/uploads/Affidavit.pdf>. Parental Permission forms have to be signed by the competitor and parent **AFTER** January 1, 2018. They are only good for the current calendar year. You can print the Parental Permission Form after 3 January by going to http://thecmp.org/wp-content/uploads/Jr_Release.pdf. The forms may be submitted at check-in.

There will be full-refunds up until two weeks prior to the match. Competitors that cancel within the two weeks will receive a 50% refund. No refunds will be issued the day of the competitions.
