

CMP SMALLBORE



General Information: The Civilian Marksmanship Program is excited to foster the return of smallbore competitions to Camp Perry, Ohio. With the aid of experienced smallbore competitors, the CMP has established a competition schedule that is rich in tradition but also introduces new opportunities to the smallbore community. All firing will take place on Rodriguez and Petrarca Ranges. Rodriguez range will have a covered firing line.

Dates: 16 – 22 July, 2018

Camp Perry Check-In & In-Processing: When competitors arrive at Camp Perry, all must first go to the National Matches Welcome Center (In-Processing) in Building #3. The check-process for competitors and Team Officials includes: 1) complete or provide a Post Locator Form for emergency contacts, 2) sign or provide an Eligibility Affidavit and Liability Form or confirm that you have previously signed one of these forms (Juniors under 18 must provide a signed Parental Consent Form), 3) confirm your event entry data, 4) receive your competitor labels, 5) receive your squadding information, 6) receive your National Matches Program and Welcome Packet, 7) receive a wrist band confirming you have completed In-Processing. Notaries will be on duty at the National Matches Welcome Center to notarize Eligibility Affidavits.

Rules: 2018 CMP Competition Rules for Smallbore Rifle

Scoring: The CMP has partnered with Shooter's Technology to develop a new method for scoring smallbore targets. At the conclusion of each stage of fire, CMP Range Officers (equipped with tablets) will walk down range to take a picture of each target. Target images will be sent to the Orion Scoring System and scored by CMP Staff. When scoring is complete, scores will be uploaded to CMP's Club and Competition Tracker. Competitors will be allowed to remove and/or replace their targets for the subsequent stage of fire. Range officers will collect all targets after competitors have removed them from the target frames.

THREE-POSITION NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

General Information: The Three-Position National Championship will consist of two days of 3x40 competitions. On Tuesday July 17th, competitors will be required to use metallic sights (Rule 5.2.1). On Wednesday July 18th, competitors are permitted to use any sight under Rule 5.2. There will be an Elimination Final (Rule 6.6.2) on July 18th for the top eight (8) Open and Junior competitors, based on the two-day aggregate.

Dates-Time: July 17 & 18, Firing will begin at 8:00AM both days (2 relays)

Entry Fee: \$90 Open, \$75 Juniors

Course of Fire: The three-position course of fire (Rule 6.6) is fired at 50 Meters, in Kneeling, Prone and Standing. The number of shots and time limits are found in the table below. On Wednesday, July 18, a Finals will be conducted for the Top-8 Open and Junior competitors. The Finals will take place on Petrarca Range, on the CMP's KTS Target System. The Three-Position Final will be an elimination final run in accordance to rule 6.6.2.

THREE-POSITION TEAM NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

General Information: The three-position team match is designed to give shooters the opportunity to compete side-by-side with club members, family and friends. The event will give team members an opportunity to coach their teammates as two members will fire at a time.

Dates-Time: July 19, Firing will begin at 8:00AM

Entry Fee: \$100 Open Teams, \$80 Junior Teams

Course of Fire: Each member of the four-person team fires the 3x20 course of fire. At least two team members from each team must fire with metallic sights. Firing is conducted at 50 meters in the Kneeling, Prone and Standing positions. Each team will be assigned two firing points. Two team members will fire simultaneously, with the additional two members firing immediately after the completion of each stage of fire (position). A target change will be conducted between the pairs of shooters. All four team members and one coach can be present on the firing line while firing is conducted.

Team Composition: Teams must be made up of four team members and may have one non-firing coach. Teams may designate Club, State Association, Junior Club and Junior State Association Teams. At-Large and At-Large Junior teams are permitted.

Registration: Team cards must be picked up and paid for at Camp Perry Check-in and In-Processing (Center doors of Building #3).

PRONE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

General Information: The Prone National Championship will consist of two days of Prone competition, followed by a unique Prone Elimination Event on the morning of day three. On the first day, competitors will be required to use metallic sights (Rule 5.2.1). On day two, competitors are permitted to use any sight under Rule 5.2. The Prone Elimination Event will be conducted on day three and will be conducted on CMP Targets on Petrarca Range. This range features electronic rifle targets, with technology provided by Kongsberg Target Systems (KTS). Participation in the Prone Elimination Event will be based on the previous two-day aggregate. All participants are encouraged to attend this spectator-friendly event.

Dates-Time: July 20 & 21 (1600) July 22 (Prone Elimination Event), Firing will begin at 8:00AM

Entry Fee: \$90 Open, \$75 Juniors

Course of Fire: The course of fire will consist of two days of 1600, following the chart below. The Prone Elimination Event will be conducted in three phases, each phase starting from zero. During phase one, one relay of competitors from the two-day prone aggregate will fire a Dewar match. The top 40% of competitors from stage one will move on to the second phase, a 100-yard match (40 shots). The final stage will be for the top 10 competitors and will follow the prone final course of fire (Rule 6.6.5).

PRONE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

General Information: The prone team match is designed to give shooters the opportunity to compete side-by-side with club members, family and friends. The event will give team members an opportunity to coach their teammates as two members will fire at a time.

Dates-Time: July 22, Firing will begin at 12:00PM

Entry Fee: \$100 Open Teams, \$80 Junior Teams

Course of Fire: Each member of the four-person team fires a Dewar match. At least two team members from each team must fire with metallic sights. Each team will be assigned two firing points. Two team members will fire simultaneously, with the additional two members firing immediately after the completion of each yard line. A target charge will be conducted between the pairs of shooters. All four team members and one coach can be present on the firing line while firing is conducted.

Team Composition: Teams must be made up of four team members and may have one non-firing coach. Teams may designate Club, State Association, Junior Club and Junior State Association Teams. At-Large and At-Large Junior teams are permitted.

Registration: Team cards must be picked up and paid for at Camp Perry Check-in and In-Processing (Center doors of Building #3).

Awards:

National Champions: Both Open and Junior National Champions will be recognized for 3-Position and Prone.

Classification awards, daily stage awards and aggregate stage awards will be recognized. Individual categories awards for daily stages and aggregates in the Senior, Junior, Intermediate Junior and Sub-Junior will be given. Team categories will be recognized (At-Large, At-Large Junior, State Association, Junior State Association, Club and Junior Club). Individual categories and classifications must have at least five competitors for first place to be awarded, ten for second and fifteen for third. Team categories must have at least three teams for first place, and five or more for first through third. For some categories, the high competitor/team may only be recognized. Additional prizes and awards may be awarded.

High category and classification award winners in the daily aggregate matches will be recognized at the awards ceremony. The top eight (8) competitors in 3P and the top ten (10) competitors in Prone will be recognized at the ceremony. In the aggregate matches, first through third juniors in each junior category and high senior will be recognized. All other prizes may be picked up at the front desk of CMP Headquarters. All award money will be mailed.

Any person who receives a monetary prize will be required to complete a W9 form prior to leaving Camp Perry. W9 forms can be submitted electronically or turned in to CMP staff at In-Processing. Blank W9 forms will be available at In-Processing.
