



Target Sprint At the National Matches



International Target Sprint Competition

Camp Perry, Ohio

16 July 2019

The Civilian Marksmanship Program invites you to participate in the inaugural Target Sprint at the National Matches. This match offers an international Target Sprint competition event for both open and junior competitors.



Event/Course of Fire:

Race Format: 400m run, Shoot (Standing only 10m air rifle), 400m run, Shoot, 400m run and finish. There will be a five minute preparation and sighting time before each heat.

400m Run: Participants will run three 400 meter timed running segments with shooting interspersed.

Shoot : Participants will fire from 10 meters at five 35mm knock-down targets in the standing position. Each competitor will have 15 shots per series to knock down all targets. If the 15 - shot maximum is exceeded, there will be a 15 second penalty assessed for every missed target.

Targets : A biathlon - style target will be used. The target will have five 35mm knock - down disks and will be placed 10 meters from that firing line at an approximate height of 1.4 meters.

Rifle and Equipment: Crosman Challenger sporter air rifles will be provided: however, you may use your own 10m air rifle as long as it complies with the USA Shooting Air Rifle rules. Off hand stand may be used.



Pellets: Only .177 flathead air pellets will be used. Pellets will not be provided.

Heats/Finals: The format will be determined by time and capacity available. The first heat will start at 0900 and heats will continue until all competitor have run or until 1600. Finals will be run thirty minutes after the last heat or at 1630hrs.

Finals: Finals will consist of the top five competitors in each age category.

Age Categories: The following categories will be used: Juniors 9-18, Open 15 and up.

Competitors must declare age categories before the start of their heat.

Rifle Handling : Rifle racks will be placed near the firing line. Rifles must be carried in a safe manner to the firing line, muzzles pointed up, actions open and CBI's (clear barrel indicators) inserted. When firing is complete CBI's must be inserted and rifles placed in the rack in a safe and secure manner. Any mishandling of the competitor's rifle will require the competitor to return to the firing line to correct this action or may result in a penalty or disqualification.



Schedule:

Tuesday 16 July

0730-1300 registration and check in.

0900 - First heat start. Heats will continue every half hour until competition is complete.

1630 - Finals relay. Finals will be held one half hour after the last heat.

Entry Fees:

Entry fees are \$25.00 per competitor.

Awards:

There will be awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place competitors in each age category.

What to Bring:

Running shoes, water, pellets and a competitive spirit!

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
