# JROTC Marksmanship Instructor Course RESOURCES FOR MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAMS

Update: 4Feb09

Marksmanship program resources or documents needed to conduct a JROTC air rifle marksmanship program and that are referenced in this course are listed in this document. Resource items described here are inserted in the JMIC Instructor Notebook in the sections where they are referenced. At the end of this resource list, there is also a list of organizations and companies where JROTC instructors may request or purchase other resources or supplies for air rifle shooting.

2.1. Army, USMC, Navy and Air Force JROTC regulations for rifle marksmanship programs can be obtained from the respective JROTC Commands.

#### 3. Section III – STARTING A JROTC MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM

- 3.1. *Army JROTC School MOU*. This 2-page document is a model MOU that JROTC instructors may use as a guide or starting point in drafting an MOU between JROTC units and host schools.
- 3.2. *BMC*, *2xBMC* and *NC-AR10* Air Rifle Targets. Samples of the targets recommended and required for use in JROTC programs are provided in the JMIC Notebooks.
- 3.3. *CMP Target, Affiliate Rifle Purchase and Training Materials Order Forms*. These forms can be used to order BMC (Basic Marksmanship Course), NC-AR10 (10-bull competition) air rifle targets, air rifles and training materials from the CMP. Most items are available at special team prices. Air rifles may be purchased on a delayed payment plan where payments are spread over two years.
- 3.4. *JROTC Marksmanship Inspections*. An instruction sheet prepared by the CMP for instructors to use in preparing for Army JROTC unit marksmanship inspections.
- 3.5. *JROTC Unit Marksmanship Inspection Form*. The form used by unit marksmanship inspectors to confirm that an Army JROTC unit is prepared to conduct an air rifle marksmanship program
- 3.6. Air Rifle Marksmanship for Youth. This 4-page brochure provides detailed information about air rifle shooting as a sport and how it benefits youth who participate in it. This document can be used as an information resource for school officials, parents and community leaders to help them learn more about the marksmanship activities in which cadets can participate.
