NJROTC Seniors shine at Navy JROTC Service Air Rifle Championship

CAMP PERRY, OHIO - Steven Frazier, 17, of McDonough, Georgia, a senior shooting for Union Grove High School NJROTC, won the precision air rifle title at the 2010 Navy JROTC Service Championships here Saturday, 13 February at the Camp Perry Marksmanship Center.

Yvonne Swiontek, 17, of Beach Park, Illinois, a senior NJROTC shooter from Zion-Benton High School in Zion, IL, captured the sporter class championship. Swiontek also won the Camp Perry Open sporter championship just a few weeks earlier.

The Civilian Marksmanship Program hosted the best Navy JROTC air rifle shooters from around the nation and the top six individuals and four teams in each class have qualified to compete in the 2010 National JROTC Championship on 25-27 March at the CMP Marksmanship Center in Anniston, Alabama against qualifiers from US Army, Marine Corps and Air Force Junior ROTC individuals and teams.

Qualifying for the service championship and national championship began in the fall of 2009 as a postal competition where shooters from each region competed at their home ranges and mailed targets to CMP for scoring. Top qualifiers earned their way to Camp Perry for the semifinal round of qualifying for nationals in Anniston.

In precision class, Frazier trailed Kirsten Moyer, 17, of Manzano High School NJROTC 1177 to 1175 heading into the Saturday final following the two-day three-position air rifle competition. Frazier was also tied with Chugiak, Alaska's Matthew Martin at 1175.

Frazier fired a 100 even to Moyer's 96.7 in the final to give him the overall victory by 1.3 points, 1275 to 1273.7. Frazier set a new Navy 3x20 plus final national record of 691.0 and a new Navy kneeling record of 199-15. Martin, 17, a senior shooting with the Chugiak HS NJROTC, finished four points behind at 1271, firing a 96 in the final

Martin set a new Navy JROTC record in Day 1 competition with a 593, eclipsing Abigail Casey's record of 589 in the precision 3x20, set in the National Junior Olympic Championship in July, 2008.

"It was my personal best, but I didn't realize I broke any records," Martin said after his Day 1 session. "I was not real happy shooting an eight and a nine to finish kneeling and standing," he added.

Martin, the 2009 NJROTC precision class champion, grew up in Riverton, Wyoming, and has been shooting competitively since he was eight years old, the last three

years in precision air rifle.

Moyer's solid run to the precision class final follows a fine performance in October when she set three national records and a New Mexico state record in precision air rifle competition at the New Mexico Military Institute Drill and Marksmanship competition in Roswell. In that event, her score of 298 out of 300 was a new Navy record and a new US record for her age group.

Moyer tied her own Navy JROTC kneeling record of 199 on Day 1. That record is shared with four other NJROTC shooters including Frazier.

Swiontek, the 2009 defending NJROTC sporter champion, continued her winning ways in the service championship, taking a Day I lead of 559 over second place finisher Cody Harlan at 549. Harlan, 18, of Sparks, Nevada, shooting for Reed High School NJROTC, outscored Swiontek 543 to 536 on Day 2 in the 3x20, but Swiontek widened her overall lead with a solid performance in the final and won the title over Harlan with an aggregate score of 1190.4 to 1181.1.

Alessandra Williamson, 16, of King George, Virginia, placed third in sporter class, with an aggregate score of 1168.

The championship consisted of two days of three-position 3x20 air rifle marksmanship, totaling 120 shots, plus a 10-shot standing final featuring the top eight individuals. The final, which sometimes decides the overall winner, is held at the conclusion of Day 2 firing.

In precision class team scoring, the winning squad was Manzano High School of Albuquerque, New Mexico, coached by Capt. Westly Logan, USMC. Team members, with an aggregate score of 4603, are Kirsten Moyer, Katie Fuller, Vanessa Montoya and Leona Serna.

In second place with an aggregate score of 4600 was Union Grove High School, of McDonough, Georgia, with team members Steven Frazier, Alex Landers, Nolan Ripple and Alexander Hughes. Union Grove is coached by Senior Chief Petty Officer Ralph Varnadoe.

Third place was won by Luella High School, of Locust Grove, Georgia, with an aggregate score of 4585. Team members are Patrick Nelms, Wesley White, Jacob Brown and Jackson Bailey, and coached by Chief Petty Officer Timothy Welch.

Fourth place in precision class went to Chugiak High School of Chugiak, Alaska, with an aggregate score of 4579. Team members are Matthew Martin, Jimmy Zaken, James Klepzig and Alan Mulcahy.

Chugiak is coached by Master Sergeant William Dill.

The winner of the team competition in sporter class was Zion-Benton High School of Zion, Illinois, with an aggregate score of 4280. Team members include Yvonne Swiontek, Ariel Morales, Renz Ibarra and Alyssa Siegfried. Zion-Benton is coached by Master Chief Petty Officer Dan Hackstein.

Second place was won by King George High School of King George, Virginia, with an aggregate score of 4257. Team members are Alessandra Williamson, Elizabeth Hampton, Matthew Ritenour and Kimberly Heitmeyer. The team is coached by Commander Fred Duckworth.

Reed High School, of Sparks, Nevada, placed third with an aggregate score of 4238. Reed HS members are Cody Harlan, Brandi Streit, Karen Black and Stephen Young and coached by Senior Chief Petty Officer Darwin Sharpe.

The fourth place team, with an aggregate score of 4212, was Westside High School of Augusta, Georgia, with team members Dustin Graham, Markesha McKay, D'Warren Daniels and Elijah Baker. The team is coached by Maj Henry Mitchell, USMC (Ret).

CMP's Competitor Tracker, an Internet-based results system, also enabled viewers at home to see live, continually updated results on the CMP Web site. Live target images of the shooters' pellet strikes in the JROTC Championships were also displayed on the Internet in real-time.

Since the inception of Competition Tracker, many schools have taken advantage of the technology and set up projection screens in classrooms so students are able watch their classmates compete.

Top Army JROTC Shooters Compete for Invitation to National Championship

In November 2009 postal targets started pouring into the CMP North Headquarters from 240 Army JROTC units across the United States and U.S. military holdings around the world. With those targets were the hopes of 2,000 cadets trying to advance to the Army JROTC Three-Position Air Rifle Service Championship held in Port Clinton, Ohio, on 18-20 February 2010. This event is part of a three tier championship series to determine the JROTC National Champions. The top shooters from the Army JROTC Championship will join the top qualifiers from the Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force Championships at CMP South in Anniston, Alabama 25-27 March 2010 for the JROTC Three-Position Air Rifle National Championship. This grueling test begins with the postal competition, and of the 2,000 Army cadets who posted scores, only 194 qualified to compete at the Army JROTC Service Championship.

Once this select group was identified in December, shooters started making arrangements to travel to CMP North to go shoulder-to-shoulder in a two-day 3x20 aggregate, three-position air rifle competition. From this event both teams and individuals advancing to the National Championship were determined. It was ultimately up to the shooters, and the field was very strong this year making for an excellent competition.

In the sporter class only 1.1 points separated first and second place finishers in the individual competition. It took a strong final from Tyler Ferguson of Ozark High School in Missouri to overtake his teammate, Tessa Howard for the gold medal. Howard entered the final in the lead with an 1115-40 to Ferguson's second place qualifying score of 1109-40. But Ferguson started the final strong, shooting 10's in his first two shots and finishing with the highest sporter final of the day, a 91.8. This gave him just enough lead to edge out his teammate. Rounding out the top three was Tyler Rico of Flowing Wells High School from Arizona. This is Rico's first year shooting JROTC threeposition air rifle, but he is no stranger to excelling at national level competitions at Camp Perry. Rico is an outstanding highpower shooter, winning the National Trophy Junior Service Rifle Championship in 2009 along with several other awards. He earned his Distinguished Rifleman Badge in 2007 to become one of the youngest shooters to ever earn the Badge. He is now quickly accumulating points for his Junior Distinguished Badge, and has the potential to join a select group of shooters who are Double Distinguished.

Ferguson, Howard and Rico finished the match with a 1200.8, 1199.7 and an 1190.7 respectively. All three will advance to the JROTC National Championship along with Christian Klinkhammer of Auburn High School in Illinois, Robert Rousey of Killeen High School in Texas, Amber Smith of Wythe High School in Virginia, David Brown of Grissom High School in Alabama and 2009 JROTC Individual National Champion William Eades III of CE Byrd High School in Louisiana.

Before the final even began, Ferguson and Howard had locked in a slot at the National Championship as firing members of the top team in the Army sporter match, they were joined by Lacie Norris and Cody Thompson to shoot a combined 4328-130 team score. 1SG Terry Thompson's team defended their 2009 Army Service Championship, and improved on last year's score of 4290-135. For winning the 2010 Army JROTC Service Championship, the team was presented with a Crosman Challenger 2009 donated by Crosman Air Guns. Also qualifying for the JROTC National Championship was Daleville High School in Alabama, RL Paschal High School in Texas and Brandon High School in Mississippi, who finished second, third and fourth respectively.

The Army precision class individual championship held a little less drama, with Richard Calvin of Siegel High School in Tennessee maintaining his first place position throughout the final. He entered the final with an 1179-92 and shot a 100.8 final to win with a 1279.8 and a 7.9-point lead. With this score he earned an Army JROTC National Record for (individual 3x20 by shooting a 592-47 on the first day of competition). Jennifer Armendariz of Horizon High School in Texas claimed second after entering the final in third place behind Bryan Zavala of Central Catholic High School in Texas. Zavala had edged out Armendariz with center shots in the qualification rounds, shooting 1173-80 to her 1173-75. But it was Armendariz who finished strong shooting a 98.9 final to Zavala's 97.5 to finish second with a 1271.9 over his 1270.5. All three will have

their eye on the JROTC National Championship this week and will be joined by at-large individual qualifiers David Hall of Daleville High School in Alabama, Sarah Adams of Hohenfels High School in Germany, Aubrey Dahlke of Madras High School in Oregon and Christina Lowry of Patch High School in Germany.

Determining the gold medal for the precision individual champion might not have come down to the wire, but for the precision teams it was a different story. Nation's best Marine Corps and Air Force JROTC Shooters Compete for Invitation to National Championship

CAMP PERRY, OHIO - The best of the nation's Marine Corps and Air Force Junior ROTC shooting teams and individuals braved northern Ohio's snow and cold to compete in the second of three phases of three-position air rifle 26-27 February. Some cadets left with hopes of winning a title for their JROTC service branch at the National Championship on 25-27 March in Anniston, Alabama

All three individual overall winners set new JROTC service records en route to victory.

Adam Grumbling, 17, of East Coweta High School, Sharpsburg, Georgia won the Marine Corps precision air rifle JROTC service championship with an aggregate score of 1280.6. Grumbling set a new USMC JROTC precision air rifle record with his second day 3x20 plus final score of 692.6, eclipsing an eight-year-old record of 688.7, set by Aaron Shader in June 2001.

Logan Hartzog, 17, of R-S Central High School, Rutherfordton, North Carolina captured the USMC sporter air rifle JROTC title with an overall score of 1213.9. On Day 1 Hartzog tied the USMC JROTC 20 shot kneeling record of 189 and set a new kneeling record of 191 on Day 2.

Allen Cohenour, 15 of Volcano Vista High School in Albuquerque, New Mexico took top individual honors in the Air Force Junior ROTC air rifle competition with an aggregate total of 1147.8. Cohenour obliterated the Air Force JROTC 20 shot kneeling record by five points on Day 1 and increased it by another four points on Day 2, firing a 183 in the kneeling phase.

The weekend's event was the Marine Corps and Air Force JROTC shooters' opportunity to advance to Anniston having qualified for the Camp Perry event via postal matches fired in the fall of 2009. The Army and Navy JROTC service championships were held here earlier in February. JROTC cadets from each of the four service branches were invited to compete in the tournament

The two-day competition featured two rounds each of precision and sporter air rifle matches and a final match for the top eight individual shooters on Day 2 for the Marine Corps. The Air Force JROTC, which began its air rifle program in 2007, competed in the sporter class only, but also fired two 3x20 rounds and a final concurrent with the Marine cadets.

In the USMC precision air rifle competition, Alivia Yeager, 17, of Seneca High School in Louisville, Kentucky placed second with an aggregate score of 1268.3, followed by Melissa Quartarone, 17, of Parkview High School, Lilburn, Georgia near Stone Mountain, with a total score of 1264.

Grumbling, who held a one-point lead over Quartarone after Day 1, said he came to Camp Perry to enjoy the matches. Neither Grumbling's mother Laura or his coach, MSGT John Skinner, said anything to him about breaking the Marine Corps' JROTC 3 x 20 plus final record - they both wanted him to shoot for fun with no pressure entering the final.

"I really came up here to have fun. Winning was not at the top of my list. I don't look at other shooters' scores, but I know what I can shoot so I just focus on that," he said afterward.

As a youngster, Grumbling said he got his start in the sport by shooting plastic army men and tin cans and as he got older he enjoyed shooting moving targets with paintballs or air soft guns. He joined the East Coweta rifle team as a freshman as their fifth shooter and wants to help his team win another state championship.

"I have been asked why I close my eyes before every shot - I close them so I can drown out all that is going on around me, and to calm me down," Grumbling said.

In Marine Corps sporter class, Hartzog held off a determined Thomas Wheeless, 16, of Phoebus High School, Hampton, Virginia. Hartzog and Wheeless entered the final five points apart and Hartzog picked up another point during the final to ensure his victory.

"Every time I shoot a nine, I tell myself I have to come back and shoot a 10 and I really try to do that," Hartzog said. "The last couple of months I've raised my expectations.

Regarding the final, Hartzog said he was almost frantic. "Oh my gosh, I can't describe how nervous I was!"

"But I've been paying attention to the little stuff - eating right, keeping my blood pressure under control, taking good shots," he said. Good shots simply eliminate bad shots."

In the Air Force sporter, the final couldn't have been much tighter. Only 12 points separated the eight finalists, but Cohenour didn't rattle and held on for the win. Ray Chhith, 17, of Western Hills High School, Fort Worth, Texas, was one point behind entering the final but fell to third when Robert Estrada, 16, of Clearfield High School, Utah made a run at Cohenour, tying him in the final with an 88.8. Estrada moved into second place with a 10.3 on his seventh shot and finished with a 10.5, but Cohenour's three-point lead held up for the overall victory.

"If I had placed a few more nines and 10s in the last five shots, it would have been close," Estrada said. "But I had a great time at Camp Perry and made some good friends here," he added. "I expected most of the shooters to keep to themselves but they were really open, which made it fun." The overall match was really won in the standing and kneeling positions on Day 2 where Cohenour averaged more than five and eight points higher than his final competitors, respectively.

"I normally shoot about 179 kneeling. I was off shooting prone both days. I think I was thinking about how big the championship was and where I was sitting on the bracket," he added.

Cohenour said he was feeling pressure entering the final but fell back on his normal routine for support.

"I didn't think about everyone else who was shooting - I was just thinking that I was back at my school shooting," he said.

In the four-member Marine Corps precision team shooting, La Cueva High School of Albuquerque, New Mexico took first place honors, scoring an aggregate total of 4585 points, edging Seneca High School of Louisville, Kentucky by a single point. The team of Deckard Day, Landon Shankles, Michael Abonyi and Herman Trujillo

were coached by 1stSgt Alberto Griego.

Seneca High School finished second with an aggregate score of 4584. Team members include Alivia Yeager, Karina Schmidt, Joe Zoeller and Charles Roberts and are coached by SgtMaj Gary Wilson.

Third place went to Colquitt County High School of Moultrie, Georgia with an aggregate total of 4548. Team members are Caitlin Davis, Erica Soto, Jeffrey Peacock and Richard Boyd. The team is coached by GySgt Emmett Bryant Jr.

In the Marine Corps sporter class team scoring, R-S Central High School placed first with an aggregate score of 4312. Coached by Maj. Russell Armentrout, firing team members are Logan Hartzog, Jessica Eberhart, Steven Murphy and Martina Carson.

Des Moines North High School, Iowa placed second with an aggregate score of 4261. Team members Michael Stroud, Brandon Wicker, Lucas Rohrbaugh and Emily Allen were coached by GySqt Michael Gettler.

Tuba City High School, Tuba City, Arizona placed third as team members Stephen Goldtooth, Kevin Haskey, Christina Charley and Nicholas Seimy fired an aggregate total score of 4246 points. Tuba City is coached by GySgt Tim Shaner.

In the Air Force sporter team rankings, the Volcano Vista High School team of Allen Cohenour, Jacob Harris, Jocelyn Caro and Channda Mitchell fired an aggregate score of 4135 to win first place. Volcano Vista is coached by Major Tom Campbell.

Sunnyslope High School of Phoenix, Arizona placed second in the team match with an aggregate score of 4114. Team members are Carlos Perea, Taylor Russ, Ethan Vance and Alejandra Amaya and they are coached by SMSgt Vyron McCraw.

Placing third was South Anchorage High School of Anchorage, Alaska with an aggregate total of 4073. South Anchorage team members are Leah Gamble, Kenneth Corona, Jason Cusack and Katherine Beasley. The team is coached by MSgt Keith Coulter.

It was the third consecutive JROTC championship weekend at CMP North's Marksmanship Center, equipped with 80 electronically-scored targets. The high-tech targets and instant scoring combined with CMP's Competitor Tracker enabled the CMP to post live, continually updated results on its website. Viewers could watch virtual target images scored in real-time. This year there were more than 70,000 page views on the National USMC/AFJROTC Air Rifle Championship results page during the two days of competition.
