First Pistol Events Fired at 2016 National Trophy Matches at Camp Perry

CAMP PERRY, Ohio – On July 11, the 2016 National Trophy Pistol Matches officially kicked off with an incredible show of historic tributes and the rise of today's marksmanship talent on the ranges of Camp Perry.

It all began with the traditional First Shot Ceremony, held this year at Shooters' Memorial Plaza in front of Rodriguez Range. The 122nd Army Band played to the crowd as a WWII Navy TBM Avenger, B-25 bomber and B-17 bomber soared overhead, with bomb bay doors open. Pyrotechnic "bombs" exploded in the range in front of the stands – producing a cloud of smoke and resonating applause.

Colors were elegantly presented by real-life WWII veteran Lloyd Boyer, who was dressed in his military garb. First shot speaker was CMP Board member, Oscar Mahlon Love. Mr. Love was given the privilege of firing the ceremonial first bullet downrange to begin the National Matches.

Among his many accolades, Mr. Love has been a CMP Board member for the last 20 years. He is a retired executive vice president and director of the largest bank in New Mexico as well as a former Commissioner of the New Mexico State Police (a graduate of their academy) and the New Mexico State Fair. Mr. Love is also a graduate and former Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado Regional Graduate School of Banking and former Chairman of the Albuquerque Public Safety Commission. A Civilian Aide Senior to the Secretary of the Army, Mr. Love has assisted on many governmental and private boards, and he is also very involved with youth-oriented activities.

"It is my great pleasure and distinct honor to have been asked to visit with you as we kick off the First Shot Ceremonies to begin the National Matches," Mr. Love addressed to the crowd. "I'm in awe as I stand on this hollowed piece of ground."

After the ceremony, the first official pistol match of the 2016 season unfolded during the Small Arms Firing School (SAFS). The school is led by the Army Marksmanship Unit (AMU) and military shooting team members, along with qualified CMP instructors. During the course, students learn firearms safety and fundamental marksmanship skills through classwork, demonstrations and hands-on range firing.

Following classroom instruction and practice on the range, each SAFS participant fires a true M9 EIC Match to gain a first-hand look at real competitive shooting and the opportunity to earn his or her first Excellence-In-Competition (EIC) points towards a prestigious Distinguished Badge.

Winning this year's M9 EIC Match was junior Sam Kwon, 16, of New York, NY, with a score of 269-2x. At the 2015 National Trophy Pistol Matches at Camp Perry, Kwon was the overall winner of the Junior Individual Pistol Match, placed second in the Junior President's Match and third in the Overall Junior Pistol rankings.

With his success at last year's event, he returned to the ranges of Camp Perry with the mindset of staying focused on achieving that same level of accomplishment.

"I was really excited for this year because I really didn't expect to win anything last year, so coming back in, it kind of set a bar, in a way, that I had to do really well this year too," he said.

Though the two-handed grip on the M9 was quite a bit different from the one-handed stance Kwon was used to, his instructor, decorated AMU member SSG Greg Markowski, helped him through the challenge.

"I had never really shot centerfire before or properly for any competition, and to have my own instructor teach me, it was a really, really cool experience," said Kwon.

Reflecting on his time in SAFS, he went on to say, "Centerfire can be sort of intimidating to some people. People think the kick is really high, but with the people that will teach you and the open classroom, I think it's a really good experience for anyone."

A total of 2,452 event entries were recorded and 990 individual shooters participated in the 2016 Pistol Small Arms Firing School and/or National Match competitions. The CMP thanks all of you for joining us at Camp Perry for this year's events.

Marking the 20th anniversary of the CMP, the 2016 National Matches began on 11 July with the Pistol Small Arms Firing School. The Service Pistol EIC Match and the .22 Rimfire Pistol EIC Match followed on 12 July, with the remaining matches fired on 17 July. Again, the Matches showcased a number of exceptional marksmen, including:

- ◎ Steven Reiter, 74, of Tucson, Ariz., who has become the first Quadruple CMP Distinguished marksman in history after earning his .22 Rimfire Pistol Badge.
- ◎ This year's M9 EIC Match winner, junior Sam Kwon, 16, of New York, N.Y., who earned a score of 269-2x.
- ◎ PFC Christopher Hudock, 26, of the Army Marksmanship Unit (AMU), who was the overall winner of the National Trophy Individual (NTI) Match by his rapid fire score of 99-7x, after ending in a tie with the second place competitor.
- ◎ MSG Robert Mango, who was the overall winner of the President's 100 Match, the top Army Reserve competitor in the NTI Match and was also named the overall Service Pistol competitor of the National Trophy Pistol Matches.
- ◎ Junior Glenn Zimmerman, 20, of Waterville, Ohio, who earned the top spot in the Junior Individual Pistol Match to receive the G.P. Perry DeFino Trophy for the second time, with a new National Record score of 292-12x.
- ◎ Jack Leverett III, 16, of Bainbridge, Ga., who claimed the overall position in the Junior President's Pistol Match with a score of 368-8x and was named the overall junior competitor during his first National Match appearance.
- ◎ SFC Michael Gasser, 33, of the AMU, who recorded a score of 293-5x to become the overall winner of the .22 Rimfire EIC Pistol Match.
- ◎ Judy Tant, 66, of East Lansing, Mich., who was the High Woman of the President's 100 and the National Trophy Individual Matches for the second consecutive year.

National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches

The National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches are the annual U. S. national championship in service pistol and service rifle shooting. The National Trophy Matches were established by federal law in 1903, are still conducted under the statutory authority of the U. S. Code (Title 36 USC § 40725-40727) and are now governed by the Civilian Marksmanship Program. Shooters from all over the U. S., civilian and military, test their skills and compete to determine the nation's best service pistol and rifle shooters. To fulfill the CMP's statutory responsibility to "instruct citizens in marksmanship," the National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches are open to all shooters regardless of skill level. Beginners compete and learn while shooting side by side with champions. The tradition of the matches and their competitions for prestigious national trophies celebrate marksmanship excellence and provide incentives to develop individual marksmanship skills, equipment and a national competition infrastructure. The CMP National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches are held in conjunction with the NRA National Rifle and Pistol Championships through a partnership between the two organizations. The Ohio National Guard and U. S. Army Reserves also provide vital support for the matches. The CMP National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches and the NRA National Rifle and Pistol Championships are collectively known as the **NATIONAL MATCHES**.

Following Kwon in second place in the match was Steve Turner, 49, of Elmhurst, IL, who fired a score of 265-4x, while Brandon Edwards, 38, of Alexandria, KY, recorded a score of 263-2x for third.

As proof of the quality of instruction within the SAFS course, SSG Markowski, 43, was the overall winner of the Service Pistol EIC Match, fired on July 12, with a score of 293-11x. Fellow AMU team members SFC Lawrence Cleveland, 31, and SFC James Henderson, 49, trailed Markowski in second and third, respectively – Cleveland with a score of 286-5x and Henderson with 284-9x.

Taking a deeper look at the competitors within the Service Pistol EIC Match can easily show the intense competition the event demands. Of the 400 competitors in the match, the leading 18 were Distinguished Pistol shooters, along with 43 of the Top 45. Amazingly, only four of the Top 50 competitors were Non-Distinguished.

In the .22 Rimfire EIC Pistol Match, fired at Nationals for only the second year, SFC Michael Gasser, 33, of the AMU, recorded a score of 293-5x to become the overall winner. Jonathan Shue, 34, of Stafford, VA, and SGT Ryan Franks, 28, both fired a score of 292-11x, while SFC Patrick Franks, 38, fell behind the two only by x-count, with a score of 292-6x.

Last June, just a few months after the badge was introduced, SFC Gasser earned .22 Rimfire Pistol Badge #2 and SFC Patrick Franks was the recipient of Distinguished Badge #3. The men were awarded their badges on stage during the 2015 National Pistol Matches at Camp Perry. SGT Ryan Franks went on to earn his badge in 2016, as did Shue.

Over 25 badges have been presented since the installation of the .22 Rimfire EIC Match in 2015. So far, no women have been awarded the new badge, leaving that history-making role open for some female competitor in the future.

Reiter Becomes First Quadruple CMP Distinguished Badge Marksman

Steven Reiter, 74, of Tucson, AZ, has become the first Quadruple CMP Distinguished marksman in history.

Reiter received his most recent Distinguished Badge at the 2016 National Trophy Pistol Matches at Camp Perry – earning the new .22 Rimfire Pistol Badge, which has only been in existence since 2015.

Before that, Reiter had earned his Pistol Distinguished Badge in 1972, International Badge in 1973 and his Rifle Distinguished Badge in 1998. Through the years, he has competed in free pistol, standard pistol, air pistol and centerfire events as well as rifle.

“It’s a big honor, really. When you’re the first at anything, it’s a big honor,” he said. “Most people don’t understand how much work it is. And it being a CMP badge . . . it means something.”

A former U.S. Army Reserve Team member, his extensive list of credentials over his long and incredible career includes:



A participant in over 40 National Matches during his lifetime, he continues to be an admirable competitor. Along with five National Champion titles, he is also a 10-time winner of the National Match High Senior award for pistol.

You can't come out here and just shoot. You've got to really work at it, like anything else, to get to the top of your field."

"It feels great. It feels great to be the first," he added.

PFC Hudock Earns First NTI Win at 2016 National Trophy Pistol Matches

CAMP PERRY, Ohio – In a tight National Trophy Individual (NTI) Pistol Match, fired on July 17, PFC Christopher Hudock, 26, of the Army Marksmanship Unit (AMU), received his name on the General Custer Trophy as the overall winner by finishing strong in the last stage of the event – earning the win by his rapid fire score of 99-7x.

At the end of the match, PFC Hudock was left tied with MSG Robert Mango, 42, of the U.S. Army Reserve team, with a score of 292-15x. In the result of a tie, the rapid fire scores are compared, with PFC Hudock firing just two x's above MSG Mango.

The 2016 National Pistol Matches was PFC Hudock's first as a member of the AMU pistol team, having been named a member in July 2015. A strong competitor since he was a junior, PFC Hudock became Distinguished in rifle before moving to pistol, where he worked to earn his Service Pistol distinction in 2012 as well as a .22 Rimfire Pistol distinction in 2016.

A true versatile marksman, he serves as an example to those who may also choose to make the move from rifle to pistol, sending words of encouragement by saying, "I came from the rifle side of the house – I've got half of my life on the Service Rifle. Anyone who transfers over to pistol at any capacity, it's going to be a kick in the gut. Your eyes will really open."

"But, don't give up if it's something you want," he added. "You can do it."

Though falling short in the NTI Match, MSG Mango still managed to garner a fantastic showing at Nationals as the overall winner of the President's 100 Match, the top Army Reserve competitor in the NTI Match and was also named the overall Service Pistol competitor of the National Trophy Pistol Matches.

In team competition, USAMU Blue won its 10th consecutive National Trophy Pistol Team Match with a score of 1150-43x. Firing team members were SGT Ryan Franks, SSG Greg Markowski, PFC Christopher Hudock and SFC Lawrence Cleveland.

Junior Glenn Zimmerman, 20, of Waterville, OH, earned the top spot in the Junior Individual Pistol Match to receive the G.P. DeFino Trophy for the second time, with a new National Record score of 292-12x.

His first win came in 2013, when he also earned the overall junior pistol title. He earned that honor again the following year, along with becoming the winner of the Junior President's Pistol Match – making him no stranger to the pressure that comes with competing at the National Match level.

"Mentally, competing out here gets a little bit easier. Some years are a little bit harder than others, with weather, like we saw this year, but mentally I become comfortable with it and I know what to expect," he said. "I can tailor my gear to the conditions, I know what I have works, and it all comes down to me."

At his first National Match appearance, Jack Leverett III, 16, of Bainbridge, GA, claimed the overall position in the Junior President's Pistol Match with a score of 368-8x and was named the overall junior competitor. He also teamed up with his brother, Henry, to fire a combined score of 559-9x for the Junior Team Trophy. The team is coached by their dad, Jack Jr.

"It was really fun," he said. "[The competitors at National Matches] are great examples for everyone. They're someone to look up to, so I enjoyed being around them."

National Match Competitor Fires Rare Pistol Pertinent to CMP History

CAMP PERRY, Ohio – Will Murray, 39, of Charleston, S.C., was an elated and wide-eyed visitor to Camp Perry during the 2016 National Trophy Pistol Matches. His first time ever attending the event, he had never even competed in a Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) competition in his life yet still arrived with a fascinating piece of its past – one that heralded what the organization is today.

As an assistant coach for the Citadel Pistol Shooting team, which trains a gaggle of junior marksmen throughout the year, Will is vastly familiar with the sport of shooting and the reputation of the National Matches, but he had always been unable to make the trip during the summer to the "World Series" of marksmanship.

"I've been trying to get here for about 15 years," he said with a grin.

Compelled by the decision to finally fulfill his dream this year, Will packed up his car and drove 15 hours non-stop to the National Matches. And when it came to what gun he would fire when he got there, he only had one in mind – a 1911 pistol originally purchased from the Anniston Army Depot in Alabama back in 1960. The pistol itself contains elements that garner a closer look, including patent dates from the 1800's. "I thought that it would be cool to bring it back to a CMP program for a national event," he said. "What better timing. I've always wanted to shoot this event, I've got a pistol that came from the program, you know, so I said, 'Let's make it happen.'"

Will's uncle, Neil J. McDaid, bought the pistol in 1960 for the bargain price of \$12 while taking classes in Alabama and on duty in the Army – back when the CMP was known as the Director of Civilian Marksmanship (DCM). As a big supporter of gun ownership and the programs affiliated with promoting the practice, Will's uncle had aspirations of traveling to Camp Perry with the pistol himself, but, sadly, passed away three years ago without ever setting foot on its soil.

"It's another one of those things that he would've loved to have come to, and it is his pistol that he passed down, so it's kind of neat that we're doing something that he always wanted to do," Will said.

Will arrived Friday evening after a long and exhausting ride – just in time for the armorer to inspect the 1911 and clear it for competition the next day. Certainly one of the most interesting items on the firing line, he competed with the pistol in the President's 100 and National Trophy Individual matches.

"It shoots beautifully. I'm the limiting factor, not the pistol," he joked. "But all of the CMP parts performed flawlessly."

His uncle had made modifications to the 1911, including the installation of an aftermarket safety that gave Will some trouble during the match. While shooting, his thumb slightly engaged the safety – creating an unfortunate jam in his rhythm.

"If it had been the military one, it would've been fine. But it just barely nudged up, so the slide locked and it prevented me from getting the rounds off in time," he said with disappointment in his voice.

"It happened twice, so I'll come back with a different safety – a better one," he joked. "It really is a top performer. I really am the weakest link in the chain."

Besides the alluring piece of firearm history, Will also brought his daughters to the event: Carolina, 9, Aurora, 7, and Stella, 5.

"I wanted them to see that, even though I didn't do as well as I wanted – I wanted them to see first-hand what it takes to compete on the National Level," he said. "I mean, if I can do it, they can do it. And it does take dedication and hard work to even come to the event."

Will has already begun to show his girls the fundamentals of marksmanship and the safety aspects of being a responsible shooter by getting them involved with airsoft guns. And when they get older, they'll have a unique learning tool in the CMP 1911.

"It's definitely going to stay in the family," he said.

Also in the family collection are the rifles Will's Uncle Neil purchased during his lifetime: two CMP Springfields 1903A3 and five M1 Garands, all of which Will plans to bring to future National Matches.

"We're definitely going to come back. Port Clinton is so nice, and everyone up here is just fantastic," he said. "We'll definitely be back – for sure."

Chichkov Wins for Third Year During National Match Air Pistol Events

CAMP PERRY, Ohio – While the National Trophy Pistol Matches fired under the hot July sun on the ranges outdoors, things were also heating up within the Gary Anderson CMP Competition Center as the National Match Air Gun events began. A variety of air gun opportunities were offered to competitors, including 60 Shot and 30 Shot air pistol matches as well as 20 Shot Re-entry and Bench matches for sporter, precision and AiR15 rifles.

Winning the overall 60 Shot Air Pistol Match was Alexander Chichkov, 22, of Tampa, FL, who fired a score of 575-17x. No stranger to the event, Chichkov had previously won the match in 2014 and 2015 and earned the High Junior title in 2012, 2013 and 2014.

Following just 10 points behind Chichkov was Anthony McColum, 19, of Purdin, MO, with a score of 565-12x and Brenda Silva, 54, of Snowflake, AZ, with a score of 564-11x. McColum served at High Junior of the event, while Silva was named High Woman. High Senior was Gary Peterson, 68, of Levittown, NY.

In the 30 Shot Air Pistol Match, junior Michael Soklaski, 19, of Ringoes, NJ, fired a score of 289-8x to become the overall winner – only five x's above GySgt Michael Lawson, 48, of Stafford, VA, who recorded 289-3x for second. Clifford White Jr., 52, of Pittsfield, MA, claimed the third place spot with a score of 287-7x.

A Top Center Shot is also awarded during the 30 Shot Air Pistol Match to the competitor who fired the closest shot to center, with the Top 8 competitors closest to center receiving monetary prizes based on the number of entries. This year, participation in the match nearly doubled – with 658, compared to last year's 377.

Winning the Center Shot Contest was Alexander Jushchyshyn, 43, of Cottage Grove, WI, who fired a 10.9 with a radius of 0.0800 of center. For his incredible shot, he received \$329. Second place competitor Greg Parker, 60, of Sandown, NH, earned \$263.20 for his win, as Hurdis Davis, 54, of Marietta, GA, received \$197.40 for third. Competitors in the fourth, fifth and sixth place spots earned \$131.60 each, and seventh and eighth place each went home with \$65.80.
