Subj: MATCH DIRECTOR'S WELCOME

Welcome to the 60th Annual Atlantic Fleet and All Navy Matches! Our goal during these matches is to provide you with a premiere training and competition experience in order to improve your competence in small arms marksmanship and to prepare you for success at higher level completion. We are always looking to improve our training programs, which is why this year's match format will be a slightly different than last year. This year's focus will be on improved new shooter training and the enhanced development of non-distinguished shooters with the goal of growing a Navy team that is highly competitive at the national level.

This is important, so I want to go ahead and talk about it upfront. In prior years we have been able to secure no-cost lodging for military competitors at Camp Upshur, unfortunately this year that more than likely will not be the case. In the off chance that it does become available, we will let everyone know as soon as possible. With the situation as it is, I am encouraging every competitor that needs lodging to go ahead and reserve it now. Most lodging options have liberal cancelation policies which will give you the option to cancel your reservation should Camp Upshur open up.

Like last year, COVID still continues to have an impact on our lives and we will operate in accordance with the most current DON and DOD regulations and policies. Most importantly, if you are sick or have COVID like symptoms, please do not brush it off. Go get tested and consult your medical provider prior to showing up to the matches. If you come down with symptoms while at the matches you are required to remove yourself from training and to get tested. Test results will be handled in accordance with the most current guidance at the time.

For the new shooters who are attending a rifle or pistol competition for the first time, we will be conducting a Small Arms Firing School (SAFS) at the beginning of each shooting phase. The goal of the SAFS is to give new shooters a solid foundation in High Power and Bullseye competition and to enhance their basic marksmanship skills. We ask that new shooters come to the SAFS with an open mind and an eagerness to learn.

For every shooter attending the matches this year, please recognize that these evolutions do not happen by themselves. These matches are the result of a lot of planning, dedication and hard work, and would not be possible without the effort of the match staff. While things might not be perfect, please know that we are trying our hardest to give you the best experience and training possible. I would also ask for everyone to please be ready to help out where they can while in attendance. Setting up and tearing down the ranges is a team effort and will go much quicker if everyone lends a helping hand. The faster we get set up, the quicker we can get to shooting, and the more time we will have to train.

There will be no match message again this year. If your commands have questions or concern, please feel free to have a member of your triad reach out to me. I can be reached at william.c.hinson1@navy.mil and I am always happy to talk about the Navy Marksmanship Team.

Lastly, I would like to say that I am excited to see everyone at this year's match and look forward to the comradery, training and friendly competition that is always to be had. Stay safe, train hard and be prepared to take to the next level.

Location: Weapons Training Battalion, Ranges 2, 3, 4 and the Competition Pistol Range at Marine Corps Base Quantico are located on Garand Rd, Quantico Virginia (N38.531, W077.434). Camp Upshur Barracks are located on Bonnyman St, Nokesville, VA (N38.63, W77.53).

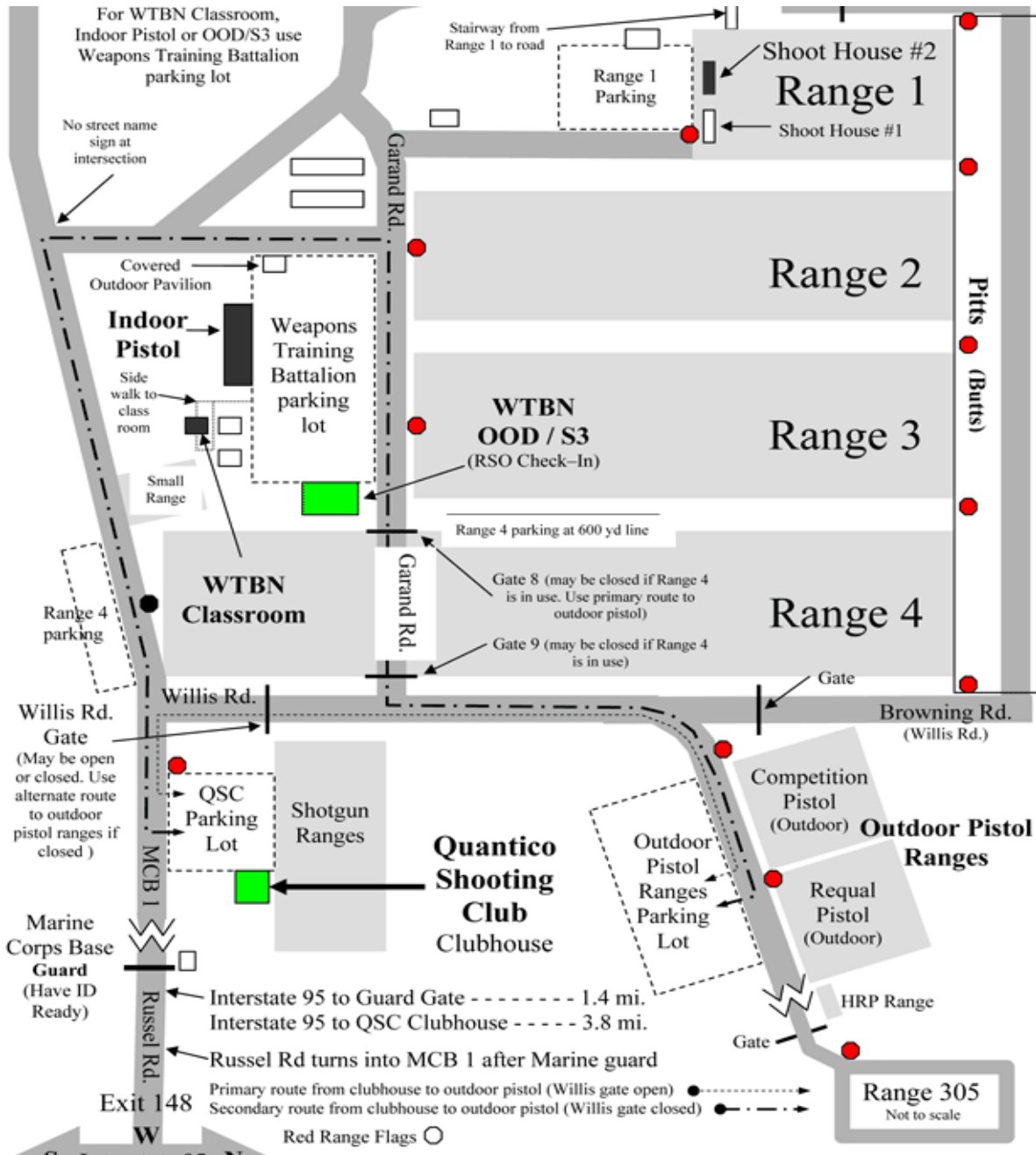
Directions: The Calvin A. Lloyd Range Complex is located on Marine Corps Base Quantico. From Interstate Highway-95, take Exit # 148. Turn west and follow the road 3.9 miles to the Weapons Training Battalion Complex on the right. At the gate all weapons must be CASED and UNLOADED. The CASE must not be readily accessible. Ammo must be separate from the case and not readily accessible. Magazines must be unloaded. If searched, you should declare that you are transporting unloaded, encased firearms to the ranges for competition shooting, and show them your orders. Registration is at building 27215, on the competition pistol range (Match Headquarters).

Initial Check-In: Upon arrival, unless otherwise promulgated, report to competition pistol range for information on where to register, confirm payment, and to receive scorecards/stickers. All weapons **shall** have a Limited Technical Inspection (LTI) before any live fire participation in the Fleet or All Navy matches. The LTI ensure that weapons are safe to operate and conform to match standards. For shooters who do not have all of the specialized competition gear for rifle competition, there are limited quantities available for use and will be issued on first come/first served basis (gear issue time and location will be announced at registration). **Please check in Friday afternoon, if possible.** This will make things go much smoother Saturday morning. The safety brief will be held on the competition pistol range bleachers (Parking Lot) at 0800 on Saturday.

Billeting: Camp Upshur will more than likely not be available for use this year. If Camp Upshur does become available we will send a notification via email as soon as it is known. **Competitors need to reserve lodging early to ensure the best choices of lodging available.**

- For the Fleet Team Match, scorecards are due to the Stat Shack no later than 0800 on the day of the match. If relay 3 is not required, the Fleet Team Match will be conducted during that time. If relay 3 is required for the Fleet Service Pistol Aggregate, the Team Match will be based on scores fired during the NMC/EIC portion of the aggregate.
- Action matches will be fired in concurrently with the Service Pistol matches. Competitors should plan participation in action matches around any required relay times, SAFS assistance, or other range duties.

Open to: The LANTFLT and All Navy (East) Championships are open to both Military and Civilian shooters, up to the range limit of 200 (4 relays). Range priority will be in the following order:

- 1. Navy Active Duty/ Reserves
- 2. Navy Retired
- 3. Other Service Active Duty/Reserves
- 4. Other Service Retired
- 5. Civilians shooting the entire week
- 6. All others

Note 1:

During any given calendar year, an individual may only compete in one Fleet match (either coast) and if qualified (or at discretion of match director), one All Navy match (either coast). For example, an individual may compete at the PACFLT matches and the All Navy (East) Matches, but may not compete at both the All Navy (West) and All Navy (East) matches. This restriction holds for all phases of the championships: individual, team, and Excellence In Competition (EIC) matches.

Note 2:

Civilians (not including retirees) are only permitted to shoot in one military EIC match for record per year. If you are shooting both Fleet and All Navy matches, the All Navy EIC match on Saturday will be counted as your record match. The match format will administratively contain both an EIC match and a NMC, with awards for the combined matches (i.e. if you are not shooting for leg points, you will be scored under the NMC match, keeping in line with CMP rules that you may not shoot an EIC match “out of competition”). **You must DECLARE AT CHECK IN if you do not wish to be “in competition” for EIC points in any match.**

Registration Fees: Each competitor will pay \$50 per competition (pistol or rifle) or portion thereof. In other words, whether you shoot one match or all of a match (rifle or pistol), the fee is \$50. The .22 EIC match is a separate match from the pistol matches so a separate fee applies. If you are registered for the full pistol phase, the .22 EIC fee is \$15. If only shooting the .22 EIC match, the fee is \$25.00.

Registration: Registration will occur online via the CMP website (www.odcmp.com). Check the team website (www.usnmt.org) for the link. Payment can be made either via PayPal to usnshooting@gmail.com or via mail to Robert Ryan, 232 Royal Oak Dr, Chesapeake, VA, 23322. Payments may be made with check or PayPal only or cash or credit card at check in. Please do not send a money order. Make checks out to “USNST”. Please pay in advance if at all possible. If you are unable to attend after paying, you will be issued a refund. Mail-in entries must be received by 15 April 2022. PayPal entries must be received by 21 April 2022. **To maximize efficiency for our first day at the range, we ask that all shooters register**

and pay in advance, prior to arriving at MCBQ. Match staff plans to be on site at 1600 on Friday, 14 May for early check-ins.

Payment will secure your registration for the matches in the order received. DD2760 (Qualification to Possess Firearms or Ammunition), civilian hold-harmless, and billeting Page 13 will be completed at the registration desk during match check-in.

Military Orders:

Only individual orders will be accepted. Group orders will not be accepted as they do not allow the Match Director to select outstanding individual marksmen for higher competition (All Navy). Individuals attending the Matches under orders are required to be present for the entire period of the orders (exceptions require approval of the Match Director).

The following statements shall be written into all original orders: (As Required)

1. Report to the Match Director (LANT) Rifle and Pistol Matches at Weapons Training Battalion, Marine Corps Base Quantico, VA. If qualified and selected for further competition, you will proceed to such additional places as directed by competent authority for the All Navy Rifle and Pistol Championships.
2. Transporting weapons: You are permitted to transport weapons/firearms for use in competition and training IAW the Gun Control Act of 1968, title 18, Chapter 44, Section 926A.

Travel: Travel and per diem costs are the responsibility of the individual competitor. Commands are highly encouraged to sponsor costs for Individuals/Teams for this military event.
