# NRA President John Sigler fires First Shot

CAMP PERRY, OHIO – Under a warm and cloudy sky on the western shore of Lake Erie, several hundred onlookers, including competitive shooters, officials and guests, watched as 2008 First Shot speaker John C. Sigler, President of the NRA, fired the ceremonial first shot to open the 2008 National Rifle & Pistol Trophy Matches during the traditional First Shot Ceremony on Monday, 7 July.

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP), in cooperation with the National Rifle Association (NRA) and the Ohio National Guard, conducts the National Matches at Camp Perry each year where more than 6,000 competitors from across the U.S. shoot for recognition as America's finest in pistol and rifle competition. The matches also attract hundreds of new shooters who participate in special clinics and CMP Games matches.

The 2008 First Shot Ceremony featured remarks by the First Shot Speaker, NRA President John Sigler, and brief comments by Ohio Governor Ted Strickland, and two northwest Ohio U.S. Congress members - Marcy Kaptur (Ohio Ninth District) and veteran sportsman and shooter Bob Latta (Ohio Fifth District). The 80 members of the 122nd Ohio Army National Guard Band provided musical accompaniment.

An American Flag, originally flown over the U.S. Capitol and provided by Congresswoman Kaptur, was flown in by parachutists from the Ohio National Guard's 19th Special Forces via Chinook helicopter and was raised on Camp Perry's flagpole to the playing of the National Anthem by the Lorain Admiral King High School Navy JROTC color guard.

CMP Director and master of ceremonies, Gary Anderson, provided a brief history of the National Matches at Camp Perry as he welcomed those assembled and introduced distinguished guests and speakers following an invocation by Ohio National Guard State Chaplain (Col.) Genzman.

Speaker Sigler, a US Navy veteran, pistol competitor and match official for 11 National Matches, said it was an honor and privilege to be this year's First Shot Speaker.

"I always love coming back to Camp Perry," Mr. Sigler said. "It's especially true this year as we kick off the first year of the second century of competition on these hallowed grounds on the shores of Lake Erie."

"Camp Perry is a very special place. A place where men and women have gathered for over a century to exercise their God-given right to keep and bear arms for lawful purposes – and to test their mettle in the crucible of competition and to learn who really is the very best," he said.

"It's a place dedicated to American freedom, and of sacrifices made by generations of American patriots to protect and defend those freedoms. Where even the ranges are named for the heroic sons of the State of Ohio who gave their best in defense of their country."

"It's a place where the heart and soul of American culture gathers each summer to renew old friendships, to honor a great American tradition. This place and our place in it are uniquely American, and uniquely important."

Mr. Sigler talked about the crucial cooperation between the NRA, CMP and Ohio National Guard to sustain and help the National Matches flourish.

"These National Matches serve as an inspiration and a destination for finest marksmen and women in the world."

Mr. Sigler reflected on his days of coming to Camp Perry for more than 30 years. First in a police instructor school and as a line referee during pistol phase for more than a decade. He also said he served as Chief Referee for the NRA's national police shooting championships.

"But I'm proud to say that I had the privilege of competing out there among you both here and elsewhere in a number of disciplines."

He talked about his Navy days where his Master Chief, a lifetime NRA member, encouraged him to join and pursue competitive shooting.

"The sport that brought me to the NRA and that we gather here to celebrate today is vitally important to firearm freedom and American freedom in all of its forms."

Mr. Sigler called attention to the upcoming elections and stressed the importance of "exercising the right."

"A right that isn't exercised is a right that ceases to exist. It's true that if you don't use it, you do lose it," he added.

"Freedom can atrophy through apathy and disuse. So it's critically important to the right to keep and bear arms that people exercise that right and have a personal stake in protecting that right."

"I can think of no better illustration of that fact than these National Matches," Mr. Sigler said. He discussed his decision to establish increased funding for NRA competitive shooting programs that he sees vital to the NRA and the country.

"I directed the establishment of a new NRA competitive shooting and national championships endowment. I'm proud to report that the endowment is well on its way to the \$2 million mark."

Speaker Sigler related that marksmanship competition is unique in that it is the "only sport that strengthens our national security."

"Think about it, what other sport, from baseball to basketball to track and field, gymnastics or fencing. Which sport is built upon and bolsters a constitutional right?"

"There is no other sport that can make that claim. Marksmanship skill, a sense of accomplishment and confidence, self-reliance, self-discipline, respect for others, individual responsibility, individual empowerment – they're all part of competitive shooting. They're all vital to the health of any society or any nation."

"As you walk on these ranges, remember the sacrifices of those for whom they're named. Sacrifices made on your behalf so that you can enjoy the right to participate in a free and democratic society," he said.

"On behalf of the National Rifle Association of America and in honor of a proud heritage and vital tradition, I now extend to you my wishes for good luck and good shooting during these 2008 National Matches."

Earlier, Governor Strickland, a staunch supporter of responsible firearms ownership, opened the remarks with a rousing welcome to shooters.

"I would like to say to all the shooters, whether you've come here to win a national title or just to have a chance to compete with the very best, we wish each of you the very best and good luck," he declared.

The Matches, he said, "are considered the World Series of shooting events."

He concluded his remarks by calling out the value of Second Amendment guarantees and vowed to uphold them.

"I want to pledge to all of you that are here that as long as I am in office, Ohio will be a state where the Second Amendment is honored and where the rights of the people are protected."

Congresswoman Kaptur, a member of the House Defense Appropriations Subcommittee, echoed Governor Strickland's welcome to shooters and reminded shooters that they have a solemn responsibility to respect their weapons.

"When we think of the famous words, 'the price of liberty is eternal vigilance,' those of you who will compete this week represent that."

"Respect the weapon, but also an understanding of what responsibility the using of that weapon means," she said. "It is a deep, deep tradition of the U.S. military and one that we try to transfer to our civilians."

Congressman Bob Latta, a long-time shooter at Camp Perry, lauded the partnership of the CMP, NRA and Ohio National Guard and its volunteers for keeping Camp Perry active.

"I love this place. I thoroughly respect what it stands for and I also respect the competitors here every year. It's a great and proud tradition," he said.

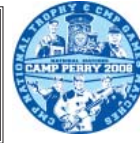
Congressman Latta concluded by thanking the volunteers. He vowed that the success of Camp Perry and the National Matches are one of the things he'll work hard to keep on track.

At the close of ceremonies, Mr. Sigler fired the ceremonial first shot with a specially engraved Bushmaster DCM XR 5.56mm competition service rifle. The rifle, donated by Bushmaster Firearms Inc., bears Mr. Sigler's name and logo engravings of the CMP, NRA, Adjutant General's Department of Ohio and Bushmaster Firearms Inc.

# National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches



*The National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches are the annual U. S. national championship in service pistol and service rifle shooting. The National Trophy Matches were established by federal law in 1903, are still conducted under the statutory authority of the U. S. Code (Title 36 USC § 40725-40727) and are now governed by the Civilian Marksmanship Program. Shooters from all over the U. S., civilian and military, test their skills and compete to determine the nation's best service pistol and rifle shooters. To fulfill the CMP's statutory responsibility to "instruct citizens in marksmanship," the National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches are open to all shooters regardless of skill level. Beginners compete and learn while shooting side by side with champions. The tradition of the matches and their competitions for prestigious national trophies celebrate marksmanship excellence and provide incentives to develop individual marksmanship skills, equipment and a national competition infrastructure. The CMP National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches are held in conjunction with the NRA National Rifle and Pistol Championships through a partnership between the two organizations. The Ohio National Guard and U. S. Army Reserves also provide vital support for the matches. The CMP National Trophy Rifle and Pistol Matches and the NRA National Rifle and Pistol Championships are collectively known as the **NATIONAL MATCHES**.*

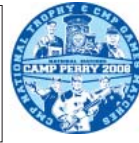

# Pistol Small Arms Firing School

CAMP PERRY, OHIO – Taking knowledge to a higher level was the theme of this year's Pistol Small Arms Firing School on 7-8 July, as 365 attendees and competitors

benefited from outstanding firearms instruction and the opportunity to participate in the third annual M9 Excellence in Competition (EIC) match the next morning.

Peggy Hedrick, 49, of Boerne, Texas attended her first SAFS this year after watching her two sons participate in 2007.

"Last year was so impressive that I was drawn into the program this year and I've learned so much," she said. Peggy gained so much confidence in her SAFS performance that she has decided to shoot a .22 match later in the week for the first time.

The Pistol SAFS, like its rifle equivalent followed later in the month, is a joint effort between the CMP and the US Army Marksmanship Unit's Service Pistol Team from Ft. Benning, Georgia. The USAMU is assisted by personnel from all other branches of the military who provide instruction and coaching on the firing line.

Salli Wandke, 47, of Tulsa, Oklahoma and her husband Harold, 47, enjoyed the friendliness of the Camp Perry environment, they said.

"The competitors and coaches are very giving," Salli said. "They are just wonderful people and that's why I like coming here," she added.

Salli, a bull's-eye shooter is looking forward to competing in pistol matches this Sunday.

It was Harold's first year at the Pistol SAFS. "In a lot of ways it was what I expected – very professional and the camaraderie is something special here."

The program features an intensive classroom session in the Camp Perry auditorium, conducted by some of the nation's top shooters followed by practical application on the range the same day.

"Where else can you go to get the best instruc-

tion available from people like that?" said Bert Cassidy, 67, of Castleton, New York.

Cassidy, who is enjoying his 34th year of competition at Camp Perry, said he continues to be fascinated by the National Matches.

"Last year I sat down under a tree with Hershel Anderson and we talked to no end about trigger control," he said. "It's the best vacation you can have."

The classroom session on Monday featured key topics including equipment, fundamentals, mental preparation, range operations and safety. Instructors discussed choosing the right kind of equipment based on what the shooter can afford and to allow the gear to grow in quantity and quality over time.

Staff Sgt. Jason St. John discussed the necessities of the sport including a good gun box, spotting scope, tools, cleaning supplies, a scorebook and safety gear.

"Don't price yourself out of the sport," he said. "As your skill level and interest grows, allow your equipment to grow along with it."

Staff Sgt. Robert Park emphasized the fundamentals of marksmanship – establishing a firm foundation, taking a natural and comfortable position and allowing the shooter to fall into a natural point of aim.

He concluded his remarks with tips on taking the proper grip and developing uninterrupted trigger control.

"Keep the trigger moving," he said, "and accept what you're seeing as real and break the shot."

Sgt. First Class Gregory Wilson, a self-proclaimed day-dreamer who constantly reminds himself to focus, talked about establishing a system and goal setting.

"Don't drive 200 miles to a match and realize half way there that you forgot your ammunition," he related, describing an incident with a friend who committed that error.

"When you're preparing for a match, lay your gear out where you'll trip over it before you go out the door," he added.

Sgt. First Class Wilson discussed the value of mapping your plan to reduce anxiety, improve self-confidence and improving performance. He left the audience with thoughts about establishing dreams, from low to high and finding paths to them.

Staff Sgt. Adam Sokolowski and Sgt. Sean Watson covered topics including on and off range training for slow fire and sustained fire, training aids, range safety, course of fire and both offered lots of encouragement to new shooters and veterans.

A panel discussion followed the formal classroom presentation and enabled more than 20 attendees to ask questions about pistol competition, techniques and personal tips from some of the nation's top pistol shooters including Brian Zins, the new NRA Pistol Competitions Manager, Steve Reiter, Ruby Fox and Staff Sgt. James Henderson.

On the range, students and competitors fired Beretta M9 service pistols at 25 yard targets. The course of fire during the range training included five sighters in two and a half minutes, slow fire of 10

rounds in five minutes, timed fire of two strings of five rounds in 20 seconds each and rapid fire of two strings of five rounds in 10 seconds each.

Tori Fox, 16, of Westlake, Ohio and her father Phil, 51, continued a family tradition this year of bringing his daughters to Camp Perry for the SAFS.

"It's all fun," Tori said. "The instructors are great," she continued. Phil and Tori participated in the 2007 Rifle SAFS and has done so with Tori's older sister in years past.

Tori, a recreational shooter since she was 10, said she also likes to sing, dance, play the cello and is also learning to play piano.

Three members of the Holland family of Alpharetta, Georgia joined grandfather Jim Cihak, 63, of Toledo, Ohio for this year's Pistol SAFS. Jim is an avid shooter who has been to the National Matches 13 times and wanted to introduce his grandsons Justin Holland, 16, Brandon Holland, 17 and their dad Jim Holland, 44 to pistol competition at Camp Perry.

The Hollands made the trip from Georgia a few years ago to participate in Rifle SAFS.

"It reinforced a lot of things I learned in the military," said Jim Holland, who added that the trip was special because it gave him some great time with the kids.

Jim Cihak was pleased with the SAFS course. "I always pick up something new here, like planning," referring to the in-class session on establishing a system.

All participants in the Pistol SAFS were awarded a certificate of completion and some earned credits toward their Distinguished Pistol badge as part of the EIC Match on Tuesday.

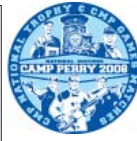

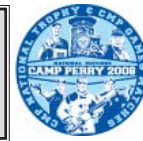

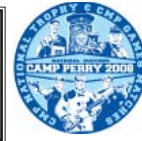

## 31 Shooters earn 4-point legs in M9 EIC Match

CAMP PERRY, OHIO - This year's winner of the third annual M9 Excellence-in-Competition (EIC) Pistol Match was Ronald Maksout, 51, of Southfield, Michigan who fired an aggregate 268-4X to earn four introductory leg points that count towards the 30 points needed to earn the Distinguished Pistol Badge.

The M9 EIC Match was part of the Pistol Small Arms Firing School that started the previous day with classroom instruction and range practice. The U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit in cooperation with other U.S. military services conducts the school. The match is fired with rack grade M9 pistols that are used in the Pistol SAFS. It is designed to introduce competitors to service pistol shooting with the current military sidearm and to encourage them to work toward achieving Distinguished status.

The top 10 percent of shooters in the match, who did not already have EIC credit points, earned points, 31 competitors in all. The match was shot by 365 shooters, 24 more than last year's match.

"I was kind of shocked to get the message that I won it," Maksout said afterward. "My son

and I came here to participate in the Small Arms Firing School and have an opportunity to bond with each other for a couple of days," he said.

"I ended up with the best of both," Maksout added enthusiastically.

Maksout shot a 96-3X in slow fire, a 91-3X in timed fire and an 81-0X in rapid fire to win the match. He is a criminal research specialist with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and a firearms instructor with the agency.

Formerly a member of the U.S. Customs National Pistol Team, Maksout shot in practical police combat matches for several years, but has never shot bull's-eye pistol with regularity. He last fired with his team in 2003.

Maksout said, like others in his field, he cut his teeth on a .38 revolver, but transitioned to a 9mm semiautomatic as law enforcement migrated to it.

"My 15-year-old son and I came down to learn some new things and have fun," Maksout said. "I was hoping to get points, but winning it was the furthest thing from my mind."

"We had a blast. We learned new things from some of the best people teaching the small arms school - they are world class."

Kate Schaumann, 52, of Cheyenne, Wyoming is a former U.S. Army shooter, having shot

matches in the 1980s at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. She came to Camp Perry for the first time this year.

"It was a good time and I can see how valuable the school is for inexperienced shooters. The instruction is first class," she said.

Her husband, U.S. Army Major Kirk Schaumann is currently serving in Iraq with the Corps of Engineers in Baghdad. Kate is a member of the Columbine Pistol & Rifle Club of Greeley, Colorado.

In his 12th year at Camp Perry, Steve Gibbons, 52, of Lewistown, Pennsylvania said the class reinforces past lessons. "I like to come back year after year because I always pick up something new," he said.

"In this sport, repetition is good because hearing it a second and third time refreshes lessons from the past and keeps them in your mind," Gibbons added.

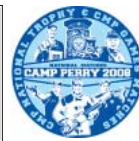

## Henderson, Hemphill and USAMU's Team Blue take top honors at the 2008 National Trophy Pistol Matches

CAMP PERRY, OHIO – This year marked the 105th anniversary of the National Trophy Pistol Matches, now sponsored by the Civilian Marksmanship Program. The matches, which trace back to roots in competitions promoted by the U.S. Department of War and U.S. Congress in the late 1800s and early 1900s, have been hosted at Camp Perry since 1907. Over 900 shooters participated in the 2008 National Trophy Pistol Matches phase which includes the Pistol Small Arms Firing School.

The U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit once again dominated the President's Pistol Match, with Army shooters taking two out of the top three positions and six out of the top 10 spots in the individual match. The matches are fired with M1911 .45 cal. or M9 9mm pistols or commercial equivalents to those pistols.

SSG James Henderson, USA, took top honors, firing a 386-12X in the 40-shot, 400-point match. USAMU teammate SSG Robert Park II finished second in a 384-16X tiebreaker over 2007 defending champion, Steve Reiter of Tucson, Arizona, the 2007 winner, who captured third place with a 384-12X.

Henderson and the 99 shooters who followed him are also recognized as the "President's Hundred" and receive President's Pistol Match medallions and certificates. The cut-off score (100th place) in this year's match was a 348-6X.

President's Pistol is a service pistol match featuring 20 slow-fire shots from 50 yards in 10 minutes, 10 timed-fire shots at 25 yards in 20 seconds and two strings of five shots fired in 10 seconds each. The match has been fired since 1981.

Henderson's aggregate score was comprised of a 189-5X, 100-5X, 97-2X in slow, timed and rapid fire, respectively.

The President's Pistol Junior Trophy match, fired with a .22 caliber pistol, was won by Rebekah Jennings, of Boerne, Texas, who fired a 371-10X, comprised of a 183-3X, 94-4X and 94-3X in slow, timed and rapid fire.

Rebekah was one of three young women scoring in the top 10 in this year's match, with Heather Deppe firing a 369-10X to finish second for the second consecutive year. Michael Thola took third place honors with a 355-4X aggregate score.

Philip Hemphill, a Mississippi Highway Patrol shooter, won the National Trophy Individual Pistol Match, defeating the USAMU's SSG Park in a tie-breaker and SSG Henderson by one point with an aggregate score of 288-13X to Park's 288-11X and Henderson's 287-12X.

The NTI is a National Match course, which is a 300-point match fired with 10 shots of slow fire at 50 yards in 10 minutes, 10 shots of timed fire at 25 yards in 20 seconds and 10 shots of rapid fire at 25 yards in two strings of five shots each at 25 yards. The NTI is an Excellence-in-Competition match in which the top 10 percent of all Non-Distinguished competitors, military and civilian, earn EIC points that count towards earning the Distinguished Pistol Shot Badge. The top 32 shooters in the Non-Distinguished rankings earned EIC points with the cut-off score at 256-6X.

Hemphill was one of only three civilians scoring in the top 10 in NTI. His aggregate score breakdown was 91-4X, 100-4X and 97-5X in slow, timed and rapid fire.

The National Trophy Individual Junior Trophy went to Ryan Nichols of Rootstown, Ohio, who fired his .22 caliber for a 273-4X, ahead of Rebekah Jennings (268-4X) and Matthew Hoff (253-4X). Nichols shot an 87-3X, 95-1X and 91-0X in slow, timed and rapid fire.

In National Trophy Team competition the U.S. Army Blue team of Park, Henderson, SGT Michael Gasser and SGT Timothy Barber scored a combined 1116-23X to retain the Gold Cup 4-person team trophy which they won in 2007. Park was the team's high shooter with a 285-6X. By rule, each team must have at least one new shooter – this year's "newbie" was Barber, who shot a 275-7X aggregate to count toward the team total.

The U.S. Army Gray Team of SSG Adam Sokolowski, SGT Sean Watson, SSG Jason Sargent and MSG Richard Hinzman earned second place honors with a 1090-18X team aggregate.

The U.S. Marine Corps Scarlet Team of Cpl Ben Footer, Sgt Thomas Kozic, SSgt Jordan Kramp and CWO4 James Fraley took third place with a team total 1085-19X.

The two-person National Trophy Team Junior match was won by the Ohio Rifle & Pistol Association YAT #2 team of Joseph Totts (275.6) and Ryan Nichols (251-1) who shot a combined 526-7 team aggregate. Totts shot an 84-0X, 99-4X and a 92-2X and Nichols shot a 78-0X, 92-1X and 81-0X individual score.

The Texas Jr. Blue team of Heather Deppe and Rebekah Jennings placed second with a team composite score of 523-9X and the Texas Jr. Silver team scored a 498-4X.



USAMU Blue Team shot a team score of 1116-23X to win the Gold Cup Trophy. Team members were Henderson, Park, SGT Michael Gasser and SGT Timothy Barber. The team was coached by SFC Jason St John and team captain was SSG Lyman Grover.

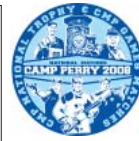

# Pistol Shooters win big with the CMP Handicap System

CAMP PERRY, OHIO – It doesn't happen too often in sports, but sometimes the average competitor gets an opportunity to compete straight up with the perennial champs and bring home the prize.

With a little help from the CMP Handicap System, Ross Chesley, of East Grand Rapids, Michigan and Ron Hawkins, of Hanover, Massachusetts did just that in the President's Pistol and National Trophy Individual matches, respectively, Sunday, 13 July.

Both shooters will be receiving customized Beretta 92F service pistols, donated by firearms designer Dr. Nicolas Abrishamian of Mountain Competition.

In President's Pistol, Chesley, 42, shot a 346-6X actual aggregate score adjusted to a 440-6X with the handicap. Chesley's effort exceeded his normal average by enough points to boost him into the top position.

"I made friends with the mud!" Chesley said afterward. "That way it wasn't a distraction."

Chesley said recent rain had turned footing treacherous at the firing line and rather than letting it bother him, he settled in early and dealt with it.

"It was a fantastic event," he said. "Once the mud was no longer an issue, I just concentrated on making good shots – and having a lot of fun!"

The East Grand Rapids, Michigan resident began shooting hard ball in 2000 with his dad and said as he shot more he began to make steady improvement and having more fun.

He also credited the Pistol Small Arms Firing School for opening his eyes to new things.

"Learning in that environment with a different pistol took my mind off the gun and allowed me to concentrate on making better shots," Chesley said. "I learned to be aggressively smooth on the trigger."

"Being coached by professional members of the military is really nice. What they observed allowed me to make adjustments that I would not have made on my own."

In National Trophy Individual, Hawkins, 53, shot a 257-0X actual and his score improved to 324-0X after factoring in his shooter rating.

An admitted pistol "newbie," Hawkins has been shooting since 2005 and this year marked his third trip to Camp Perry. He and a group of shooting buddies from the Hanover area have made the National Matches an annual trip.

"I had no idea I had won anything," Hawkins said. "I looked at the results in the middle of the pack, where I normally fall, and I couldn't find my scores. I just figured my score card got lost or something."

"Then as I'm packing up the truck, a couple of shooting buddies came over and asked if I was hanging around for the awards ceremony. I said, no I'm feeling pretty good so I'm going to get a head start back."

Hawkins said he was stunned to learn that his performance vaulted him into the top spot in NTI Handicap.

"This was the first year I came out with the goal of making President's or earning leg points. That didn't happen, but things just came together for me," Hawkins added.

"I think it's a great thing that Dr. Nick is doing. I compete against myself and middling to average competitors normally

have no chance of winning at Perry," he said. "It turned out to be a great experience and now others will want to make the trip."

As Chesley's and Hawkins' reward, renowned gun builder and Mountain Competition partner Nicolas Abrishamian, M.D., will build him a highly-accurized 92F featuring a KKM barrel with a 1 in 32 twist, a Springco recoil system, a Tef-

lon-coated frame and "Dr. Nick's custom honed trigger, hammer and sear group". The pistol also features a radius rail system devised by "Dr. Nick." The donated pistol normally retails for more than \$2,150.

A physician for more than 20 years, Dr. Abrishamian said he believes that new shooters who are making significant progress in their shooting efforts deserve a reward for improving.

"I'm glad that they're coming up in the ranks. Because I saw the scores; some have come up as much as 200 points. It's an enormous difference – they're really trying and they deserve something for that," Dr. Abrishamian said.

"When I started in this game at Camp Perry in 1990, it was very difficult because I came here as an unclassified shooter. I was shooting everywhere except on my target!"

"At the end if I had a good target, I didn't get rewarded for it. I remember what that felt like," he said.

"I've been giving guns and prizes away to shooters since 1996," he said. "Ed Grove and I ran a match in Maryland called the All States National Pistol Championship for 10 years."

"I used to give eight guns away along with 96 trophies – and did that for 10 straight years."

Dr. Abrishamian, who is a biochemist and physician specializing in reading and analyzing blood chemistry at Chester Woods CFS Center PA in Chester, New Jersey, is a veteran pistol shooter who relies on shooting and gun-building as a "therapeutic escape" from his intense medical profession of dealing with disease.

"It's pretty challenging," he said. "All of those with rare diseases that can't be figured out eventually end up in our offices. Everybody who walks in has something very seriously wrong – they've been to nine or 10 doctors, they've been through the hospitals and ours is the last stop."

"About 75 percent of those we treat have some form of cancer – either pre- or post-chemo," he said.

Dr. Abrishamian served in the U.S. Army Special Forces from 1973 to 1976 and is the son of an Army colonel, now deceased.

"My passion has always been guns," he proclaimed. "I would shoot with my father and complain that guns wouldn't always shoot straight."

"I learned right away that it's not just the shooter. It has to do with the weapon and ammunition and everything that goes with it," he added.

Upon completion of his tour of duty, he studied medicine at the University of Frankfurt in Germany. While there, he sought work in the Heckler and Koch factory in neighboring Oberndorf. The University and H&K officials arranged for him to learn weapon fabrication and design on weekends in the factory.

"While I was going to school for nine years in Frankfurt, every Saturday and Sunday I didn't waste time. Like a hungry man, I learned everything I could while I was there."

"I worked on the G3 submachine gun and learned very quickly that my best effort wasn't good enough. The Germans are known for their precision and I found out first hand why that is," Dr. Abrishamian said.

His interest in gun fabrication and design eventually culminated in the creation of Mountain Competition. Due to strict state firearms laws in New Jersey, he built a second home in the Pocono Mountains of Pennsylvania complete with a 2,500-square-foot basement. It soon filled with gun-building machinery and his firearm accurizing side-business took off.

"I initially came up with a rail system for the Beretta. The frame and slide never touch each other, meaning the frame never gets battered and that results in longer life and improved accuracy."

"Just like the German railroad guns, when these parts move in a straight line, the twisting motion of the gun is eliminated, giving you a chance for a second shot in rapid fire. You fire the gun, it goes straight up and falls right back into place for the next shot," he explained.

Chesley says friends and fellow shooters have come out of the woodwork since his handicap victory wanting to know more about CMP shooting and learning opportunities.

"I'm thinking about coming back for Rifle SAFS," he added.

Kowa Spotting Scopes <http://www.kowascope.com> donated two spotting scopes for the second ranking Handicap competitors in the President's and NTI matches. John Kittleson, of Milton, Wisconsin, was the second ranking competitor in the

President's Handicap. Kittleson also received a a Lock-N-Load Progressive Metallic Reloading Press donated by Hornady <http://www.hornady.com/>. PO1 Marco Chavez, USN, of Chesapeake, Virginia, was the second ranking competitor in the NTI and won the second spotting scope donated by Kowa Spotting Scopes.

The CMP Handicap System is a way to rank all competitors in a match according to how they performed on the day of a match relative to their established level of ability. In a handicap competition, the competitor who does the best job of exceeding his or her average becomes the winner.

The CMP Competition Tracker system that records match results and displays them on the Internet now has a massive database of results that provides the statistical basis for this new system. Every score fired by competitors in the National Matches, CMP Eastern and Western Games, sanctioned EIC matches, sanctioned as-issued military rifle matches that report scores and sanctioned three-position air rifle matches is now recorded in this system. This makes it quite easy to establish averages and from those averages to derive competitor handicaps.

The handicaps are based on a factor of 1,000, which reflects the average scores for the greatest number of shooters. Shooters with handicaps over 1,000 are above that level, while shooters below 1,000 are new and developing shooters who have not reached that level yet.

Each match a shooter competes in his or her handicap is adjusted up or down depending on how well they did against the average shooter in that match. The more matches a shooter competes in the better his or her handicap reflects their skill level. A shooter's handicap is based on their average performance over all matches they competed in over the last two years.

A system to adjust for matches with high winds or poor conditions was added that is based on how all competitors in a match perform relative to their established averages.

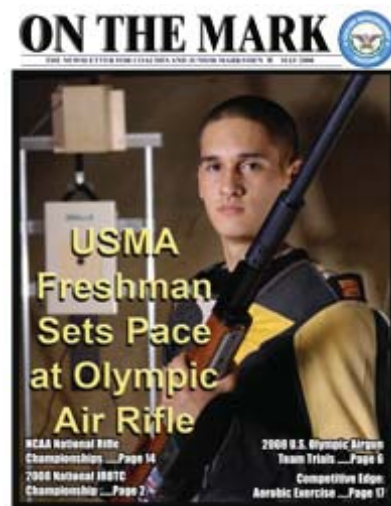
