The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) is pleased to welcome competitors, coaches, and guests to the **21st Annual Camp Perry Open!**

This year's event will feature a full schedule of air gun competition, including **Three-Position Air Rifle, 60-Shot Air Rifle, and 60-Shot Air Pistol**, along with a **Rifle and Pistol Clinic**. All events will be held at the **Gary Anderson CMP Competition Center at Camp Perry, Ohio**.

COMPETITION HOST. The Civilian Marksmanship Program will host this event at the Gary Anderson CMP Competition Center, located on Camp Perry, Ohio.

COMPETITION EVENTS.

- **3x20 Junior Air Rifle** – This event is governed by the **National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules**, and participants must be juniors who are eligible under Rule 3.1. EIC award points will be awarded at this competition.
- **3x20 Junior Team Match** - Teams are comprised of four firing members. There is no pre-registration for teams. Pick up team cards at check-in. Teams must comply with Rule 3.2 of the National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rulebook.
- **Clinic** – On Saturday, there will be a clinic for open and junior competitors. Competitors can choose between a rifle and pistol clinic. Those wishing to attend should pre-register. This is a classroom clinic.
- **60 Shot Air Rifle** – The air rifle event is open to both men and women of all ages. It is a two-day event where competitors will fire 60 standing shots on Saturday and again on Sunday. EIC award points will be awarded at this competition.
- **60 Shot Air Pistol** – The air pistol event is open to both men and women of all ages. It is a two-day event where competitors will fire 60 shots on Saturday and again on Sunday. EIC award points will be awarded at this competition.

- **Adaptive Shooting Events** – Adaptive shooting events will be fired under the World Shooting Para Sport classification system. Adaptive shooters will fire concurrently with the rifle or pistol disciplines, and athletes should register for an event, and then select a WSPS category.
- **60 Shot Team Matches** – Teams are comprised of three firing members from the 60-shot rifle and pistol events. This match is not fired separately from the individual matches. There is no pre-registration for team events. Team cards can be picked up and paid for at check-in. Team awards will be for open and junior teams. Pick-up or unrestricted teams are allowed.
- **Super Final** – There will be a super final on Saturday. The Super Final will be an elimination final. This event is intended to be a fun experience for athletes and spectators. The top 38 shooters in Air Rifle and the top 38 shooters in Air Pistol (based on Saturday's match results) will qualify for the super final.

SQUADDING.

For the 3x20 event, please indicate on your registration which relay you would *prefer* to fire on. We will try to honor all squadding requests, but relays will be filled in the order that entries are received. We will also try to squad all teams together on the firing line. Squadding will be random for smallbore and for Saturday's 60-shot air rifle and air pistol matches. Sunday's match squadding will be based on Saturday's results. **Squadding will be posted on-line at least 1 week prior to the event.**

RULES.

3x20 - The competition will be governed by the ***National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules***. Copies of the rules may be downloaded from the CMP website at <https://thecmp.org/air/national-standard-three-position-air-rifle-rules/>.

SCORE POSTING.

All scores fired will be displayed on the CMP Competitor Tracker results system at <http://ct.thecmp.org/2027CPOResults>. Scores and competitor rankings will be displayed electronically on the range throughout the competition.

TRAINING.

The air range will be open for training the week of the Camp Perry Open. Fees are: \$5.00 for juniors and \$10.00 for adults and should be paid at the front desk when you arrive each day. Open Tuesday evening from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. The range will also be open during the day Tuesday through Thursday (9am-3pm) and Friday (9am-1pm). AWARDS.

3x20 Air Rifle - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual awards and 1st, 2nd and 3rd place team awards will be presented for both sporter and precision classes. Individual winners in sporter and precision classes will be awarded checks (\$200 – 1st place, \$150 – 2nd place, \$100 – 3rd place). Team awards will be given for the 1st – 3rd place teams in each category.

60 Shot Air Rifle and Air Pistol - 1st, 2nd and 3rd for Open and Junior categories will be awarded. Individual overall winners in rifle and pistol classes will receive award checks in the amounts of: 1st - \$500, 2nd - \$400, 3rd – \$300. U15 and U18 medals will be awarded for 1-3rd. Team awards will be given to 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall and junior teams in rifle and pistol.

EQUIPMENT.

Equipment Control – There will be no official equipment control, but equipment will be checked on the range.

Prone mats – Prone mats are provided in the air range, but personal mats may be used.

Spotting Scopes - The matches will be fired on Megalink electronic targets. Shooters should not bring spotting scopes.

Air and CO₂ - Compressed air and CO₂ gas will be available at the range.

Shipping Air Cylinders - Teams that plan to fly to and do not wish to check air or CO₂ cylinders on their air flights may ship them in advance to:

Air cylinder packages must have the name of the school, JROTC unit, or club printed on the outside of the package. It is recommended that FedEx or UPS be used so that the shipment can be located with a tracking number. **Please purchase a return label in advance and bring it with you to return your cylinders home.**

CMP Affidavit and Liability release before competing at Camp Perry. To submit an affidavit, go to your profile on Competition Tracker. Athletes under the age of 18 *must* have a 2027 Parental Permission Form completed before competing at Camp Perry. There will be full refunds up until two weeks before the match. Competitors that cancel within two weeks, but before 24 hours before the event will receive a 50% refund. No refunds will be issued one day before or the day of the event.
